

Background:

Paul "the Apostle" was a violent Jewish religious pharisee until the risen Jesus Christ confronted him and called him to a new mission of preaching the good news of the gospel to the Gentiles.

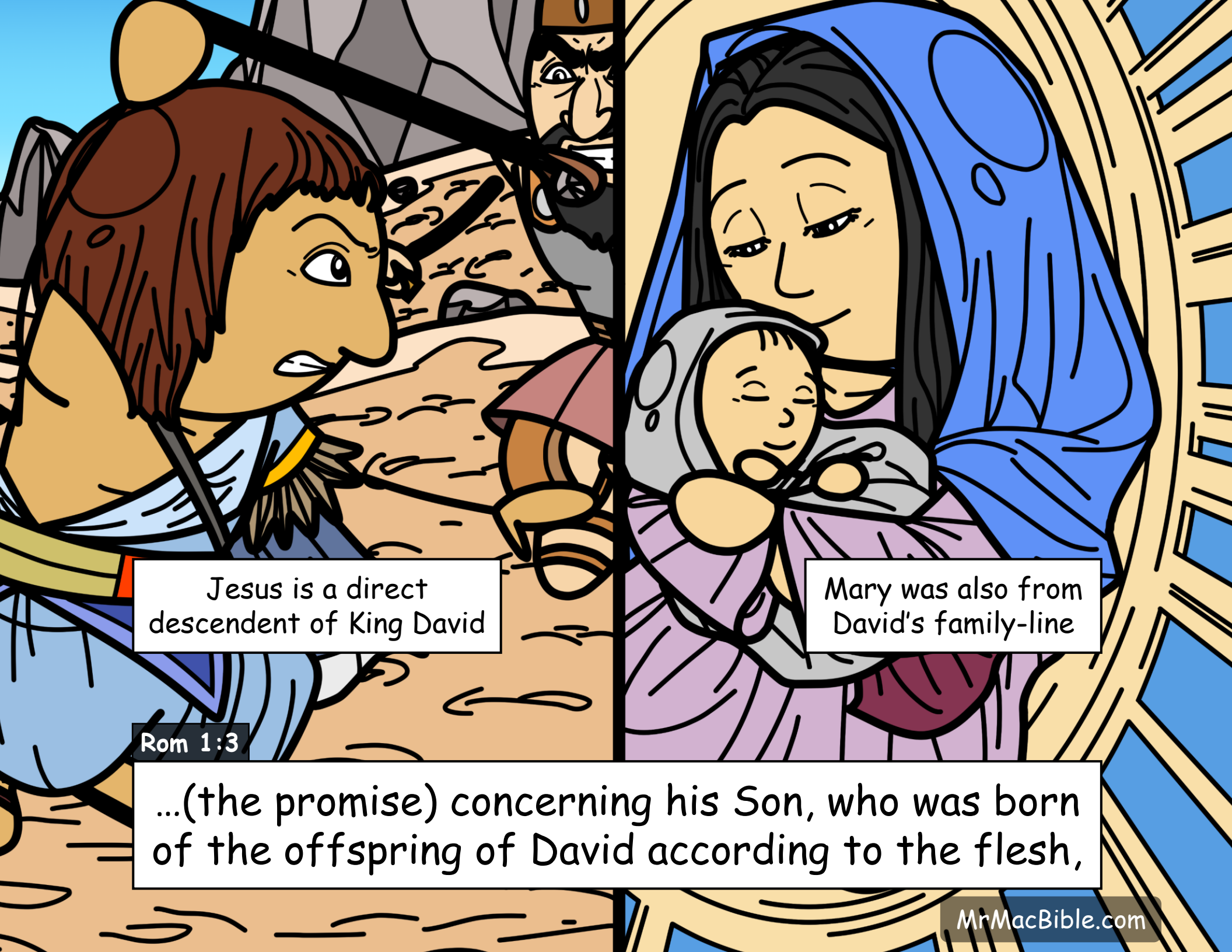
After 20 years of missionary work, Paul is now writing this letter to the Romans.



Paul is confronted and called by
the risen Jesus in Acts Chapter 9

Rom 1:1-2

Paul, a servant of Jesus Christ, called to be
an apostle, set apart for the Good News of
God, which he promised before through his
prophets in the holy Scriptures,

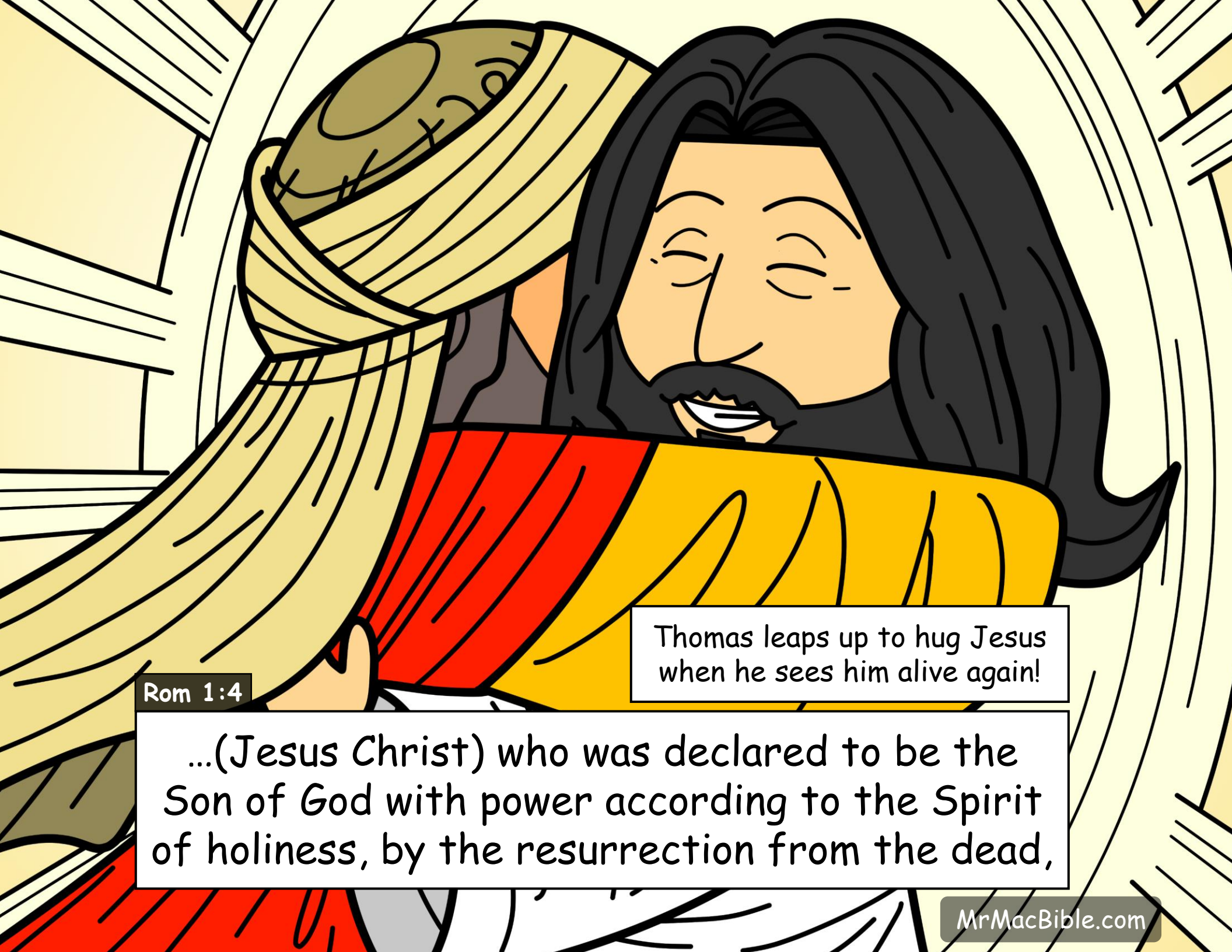


Jesus is a direct
descendent of King David

Mary was also from
David's family-line

Rom 1:3

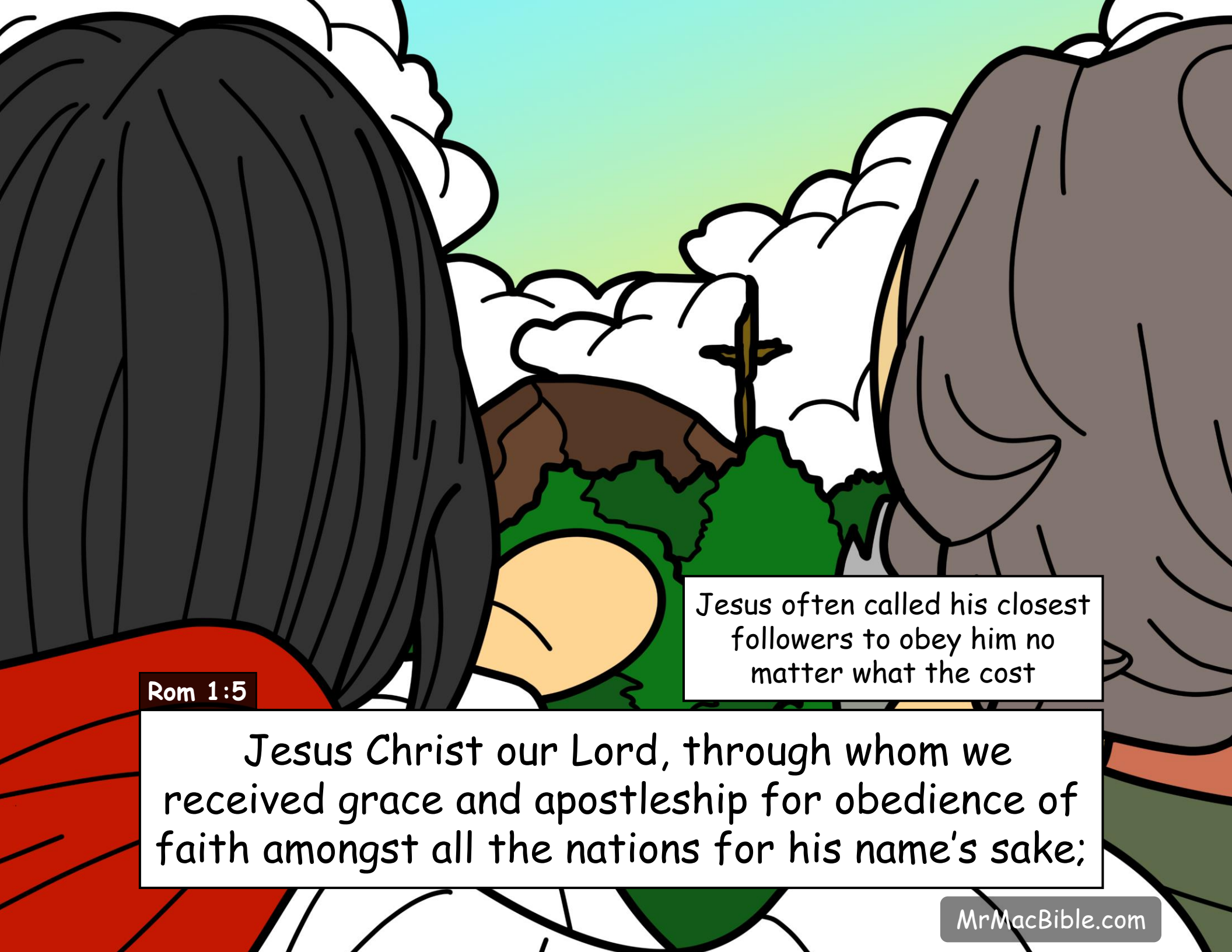
...(the promise) concerning his Son, who was born
of the offspring of David according to the flesh,



Thomas leaps up to hug Jesus when he sees him alive again!

Rom 1:4

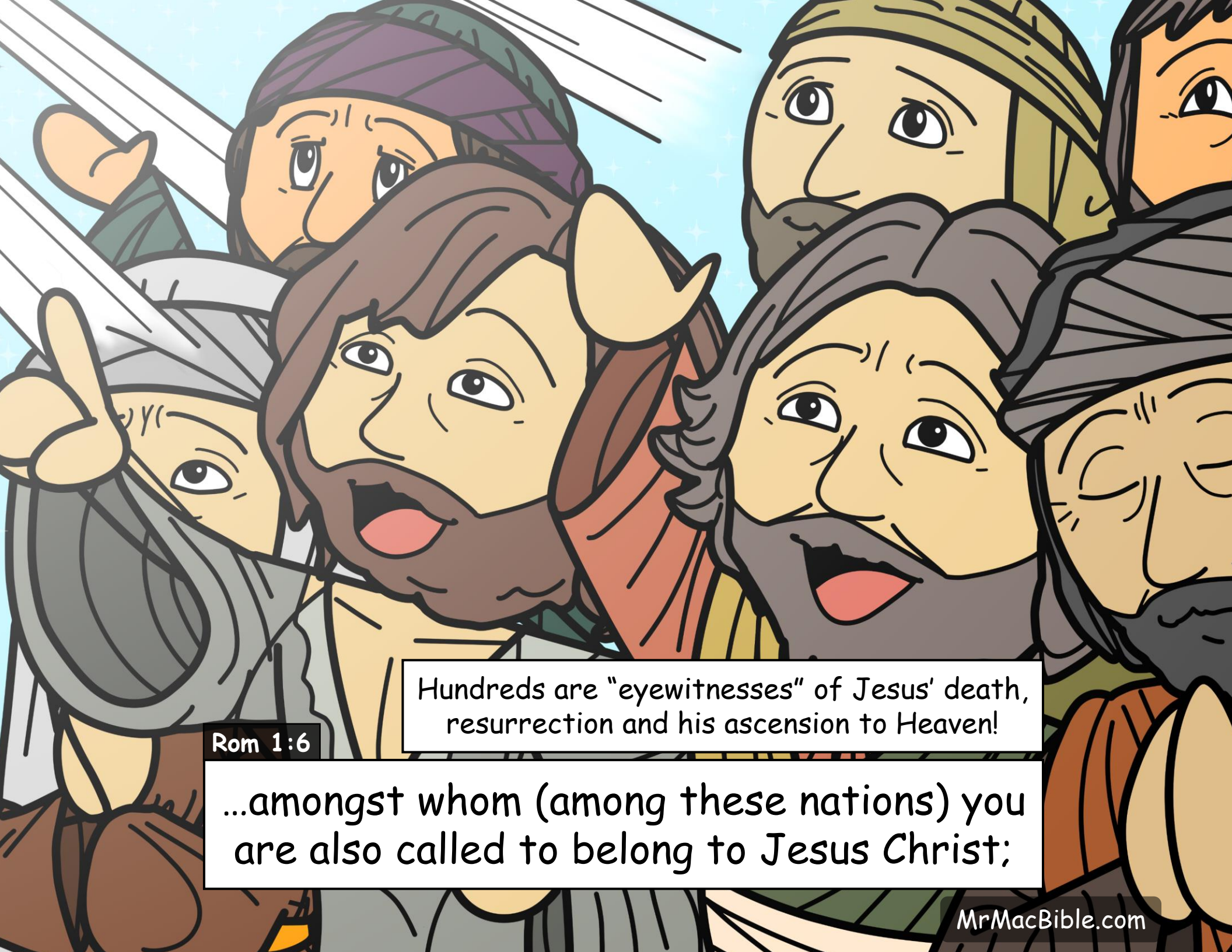
...(Jesus Christ) who was declared to be the Son of God with power according to the Spirit of holiness, by the resurrection from the dead,



Rom 1:5

Jesus often called his closest followers to obey him no matter what the cost

Jesus Christ our Lord, through whom we received grace and apostleship for obedience of faith amongst all the nations for his name's sake;



Hundreds are "eyewitnesses" of Jesus' death, resurrection and his ascension to Heaven!

Rom 1:6

...amongst whom (among these nations) you are also called to belong to Jesus Christ;

...to all who are in Rome, beloved
of God, called to be saints:

Rom 1:7

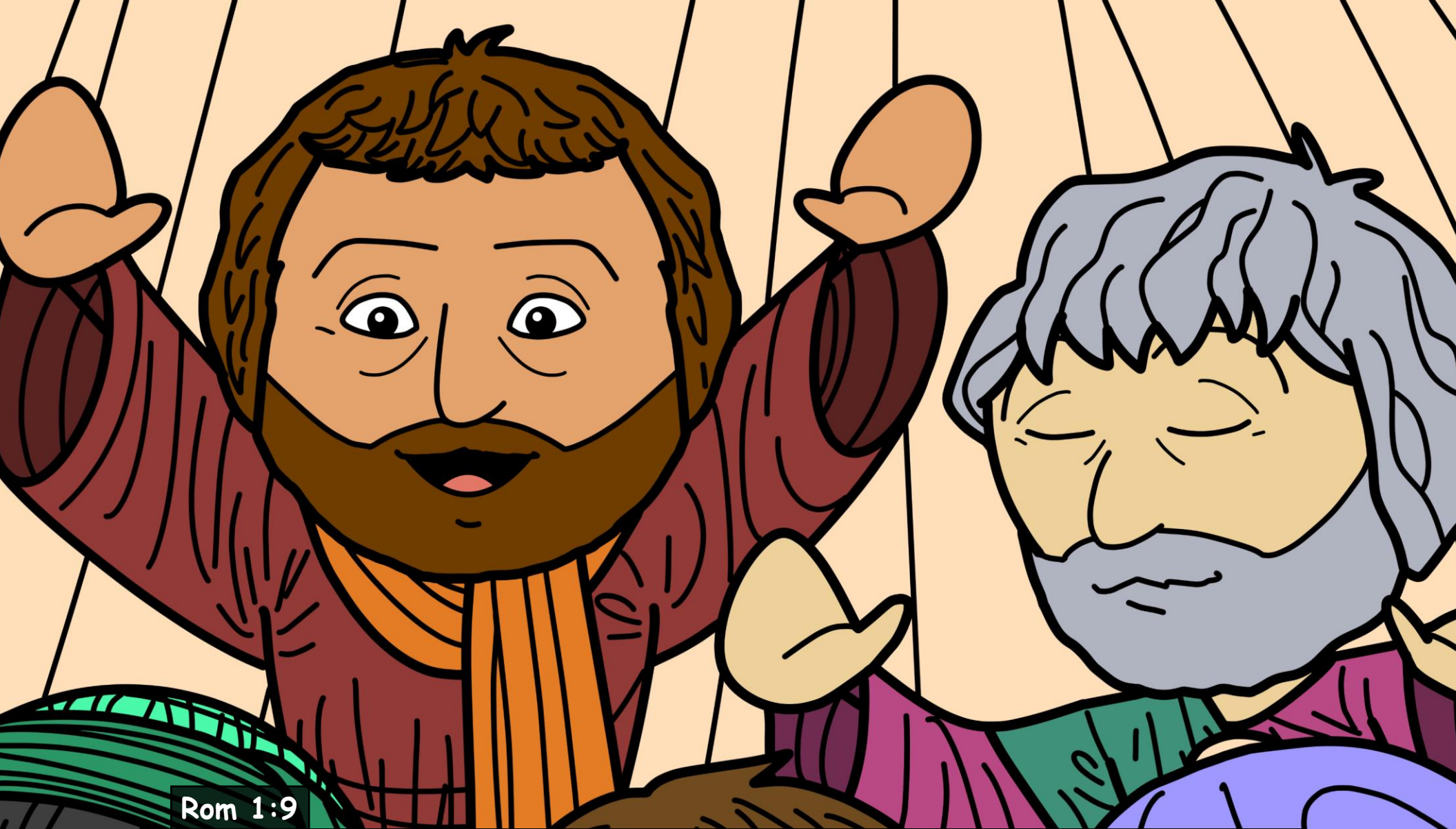
Paul often wrote his letters from jail.

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.



Rom 1:8

First, I thank my God through Jesus Christ for all of you, that your faith is proclaimed throughout the whole world.



Rom 1:9

For God is my witness, whom I serve in my spirit in the Good News of his Son, how unceasingly I make mention of you always in my prayers,




Rom 1:10

...(in my prayers) requesting, if by any means now at last I may be prospered by the will of God to come to you.



Rom 1:11


For I long to see you, that I may impart to you some spiritual gift, to the end that you may be established;



Not everyone was happy with Paul's preaching about Jesus.

Rom 1:12


...that is, that I with you may be encouraged in you, each of us by the other's faith, both yours and mine.



Read about Paul's shipwrecks in ACTS

Rom 1:13

Now I don't desire to have you unaware, brothers, that I often planned to come to you (and was hindered so far)



Everyone who is not Jewish is called a "Gentile"

Rom 1:13

...that I might have some fruit amongst you also, even as amongst the rest of the Gentiles.



Rom 1:14

I am debtor both to Greeks and to foreigners,
both to the wise and to the foolish.



Rom 1:15


So as much as is in me, I am eager to preach the Good News to you also who are in Rome.



Paul preached in the face of danger.

Rom 1:16

For I am not ashamed of the Good News of Christ, because it is the power of God for salvation for everyone who believes, for the Jew first, and also for the Greek.



Paul told everyone to trust in Jesus alone to save them from the penalty of their own sin.

Rom 1:17

For in it [the message of the Gospel] is revealed God's righteousness from faith to faith. As it is written, "But the righteous shall live by faith."

God's Wrath Revealed

Romans 1:18-32

Background:

During Paul's travels, Rome is being ruled by Caesar Nero who is sexually impure, he worships other gods, he's a liar and he's full of hatred and violence for Jews and Christians... and soon Paul will be standing before him in his royal court to be judged.

Caesar Nero is ruler of the Roman Empire



Rom 1:18

For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men who suppress the truth in unrighteousness,



Nero may wonder about the CREATOR...

Rom 1:19

...because that which is known of God is revealed in them, for God revealed it to them.



Rom 1:20

And Nero may wonder about the miracle of birth...

For the invisible things of him since the creation of the world are clearly seen, being perceived through the things that are made,



Rom 1:20

Could there be one true Creator?


...even his everlasting power and divinity,
that they may be without excuse.



I don't like the idea of a Creator...

Rom 1:21


Because knowing God, they didn't glorify him as God, and didn't give thanks, but became vain in their reasoning, and their senseless heart was darkened.



I would rather do whatever
I want with whoever I want!

Rom 1:22


Professing themselves to be wise, they became fools, and traded the glory of the incorruptible God for the likeness of an image of corruptible man,



...I want to worship myself,
my power and my lusts!

Rom 1:23

...and of birds, four-footed
animals, and creeping things.



What Nero is doing
is wicked and gross!

Rom 1:24

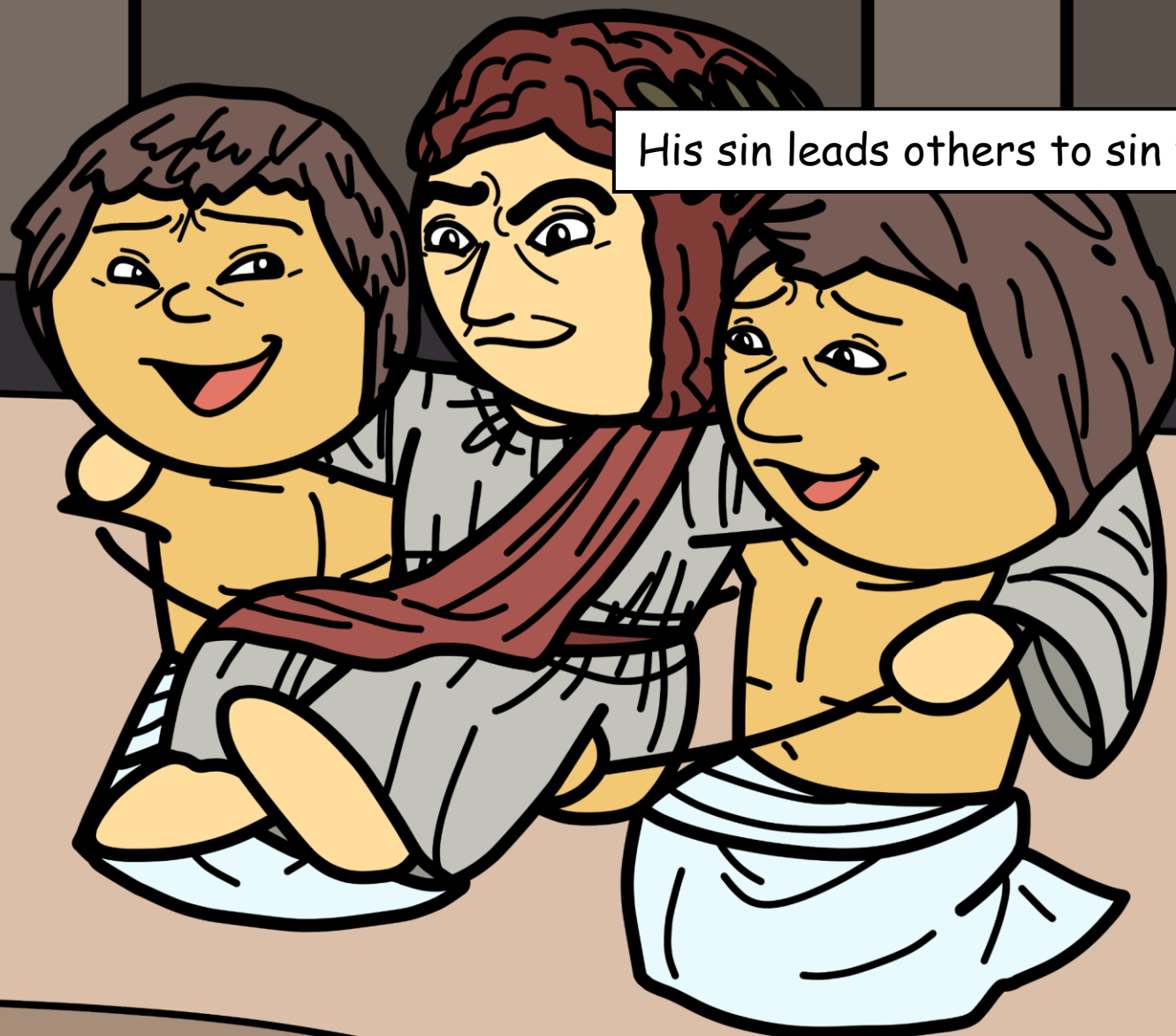
Therefore God also gave them up in the lusts of their hearts to uncleanness, that their bodies should be dishonoured amongst themselves;

...who exchanged the truth of God for a lie, and worshipped and served the creature rather than the Creator, who is blessed forever. Amen.

Rom 1:25

He worships created things...






His sin leads others to sin too!

Rom 1:26

For this reason, God gave them up to vile passions.



...and his lusts lead him
to do more and more
unnatural lusts.

Rom 1:26

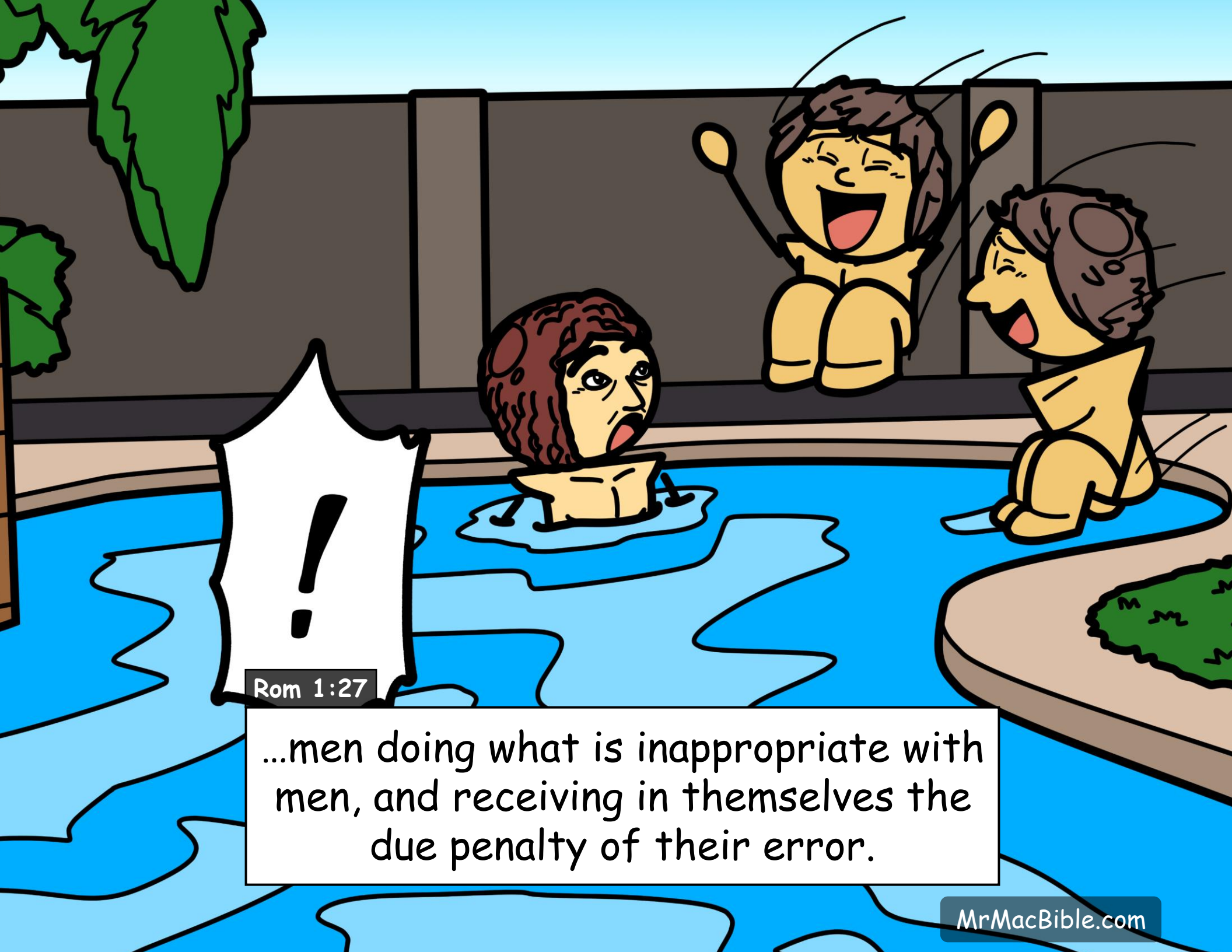
For their women changed the natural
function into that which is against nature.



Rom 1:27


His sin might promise fun times...

Likewise also the men, leaving the natural function of the woman, burnt in their lust towards one another,



Rom 1:27

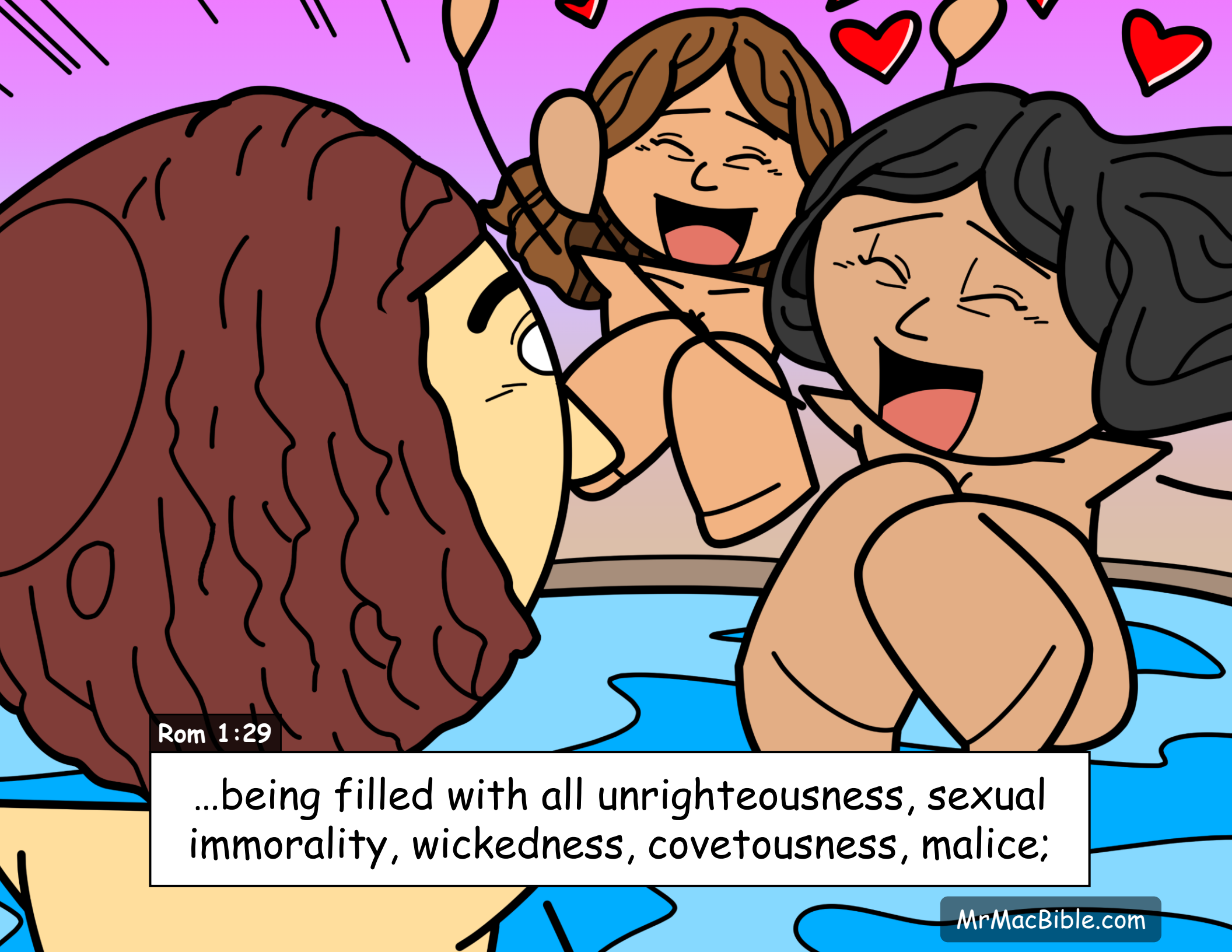
...men doing what is inappropriate with men, and receiving in themselves the due penalty of their error.



If you continue in your sin, God may quit protecting you from yourself and let you do even worse wicked and gross things...

Rom 1:28

Even as they refused to have God in their knowledge, God gave them up to a reprobate mind, to do those things which are not fitting;



Rom 1:29


...being filled with all unrighteousness, sexual immorality, wickedness, covetousness, malice;

...full of envy, murder, strife, deceit,
evil habits, secret slanderers,

Rom 1:29

Fart!


Nero's pride
leads to hate...



Until his sin has turned
his heart to stone...

Rom 1:30-31

...backbiters, hateful to God, insolent, arrogant, boastful, inventors of evil things, disobedient to parents, without understanding, covenant breakers, without natural affection, unforgiving, unmerciful;



And his sin makes him
feel **self-righteous**...

Rom 1:32

...who, knowing the ordinance of God, that those who practise such things are worthy of death,



And slowly turn him into a hypocrite!

Rom 1:32

...not only do the same, but also
approve of those who practise them.

God's Judgement

Romans 2:1-29

Background:

Paul explains that many of us are quick to judge others, without realizing that we may be failing (or sinning) in the same way! Nero, the emperor of Rome was like that...



Nero judges and condemns people less wicked than himself...

Rom 2:1


Therefore you are without excuse, O man, whoever you are who judge.



Nero never judges himself
by his own standards...

Rom 2:1

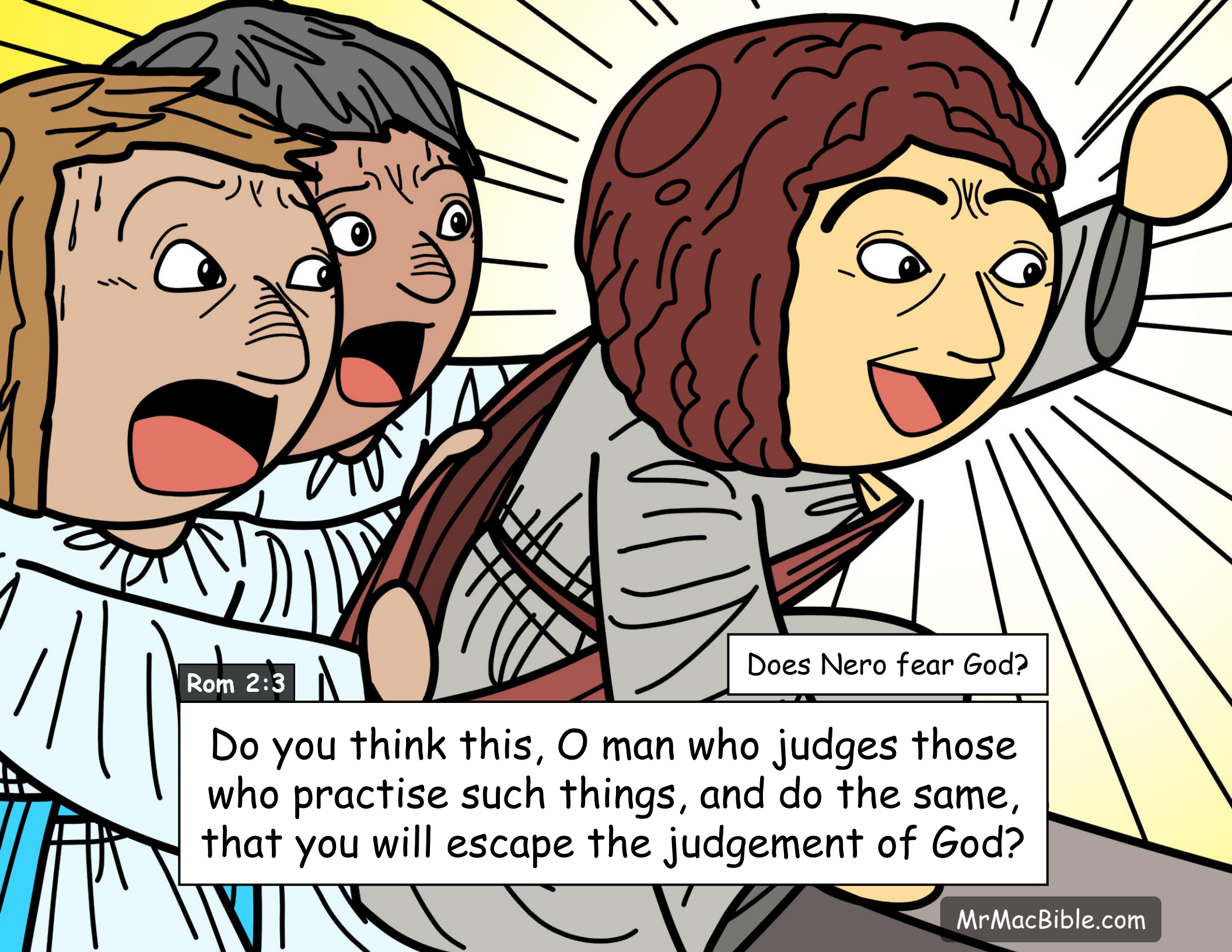
For in that which you judge another,
you condemn yourself. For you who
judge practise the same things.



...And he tells himself that his sins are not so bad!

Rom 2:2

We know that the judgement of God is according to truth against those who practise such things.



Rom 2:3

Does Nero fear God?


Do you think this, O man who judges those who practise such things, and do the same, that you will escape the judgement of God?



Rom 2:4

Or do you despise the riches of his goodness, forbearance, and patience, not knowing that the goodness of God leads you to repentance?


God wants us all to repent and turn from our sins..., and not just "pretend" to be his servant.



Has Nero forgotten that someday he will be judged by God for his own actions?

Rom 2:5


But according to your hardness and unrepentant heart you are treasuring up for yourself wrath in the day of wrath, Romans, and of the righteous judgement of God,



Doesn't he know that he could choke and die anytime?

Rom 2:6


[God] ...who "will pay back to everyone according to their works:"



...Someday God will judge Nero for his bad actions... and God will reward others for their good faith, courage and kindness.

Rom 2:7


...to those who by perseverance in well-doing seek for glory, honour, and incorruptibility, eternal life;



But Nero has chosen to hate those that do good!

Rom 2:8-9


...but to those who are self-seeking and don't obey the truth, but obey unrighteousness, will be wrath, indignation, oppression, and anguish on every soul of man who does evil, to the Jew first, and also to the Greek.



While others feel too afraid to stand for faith and goodness...

Rom 2:10

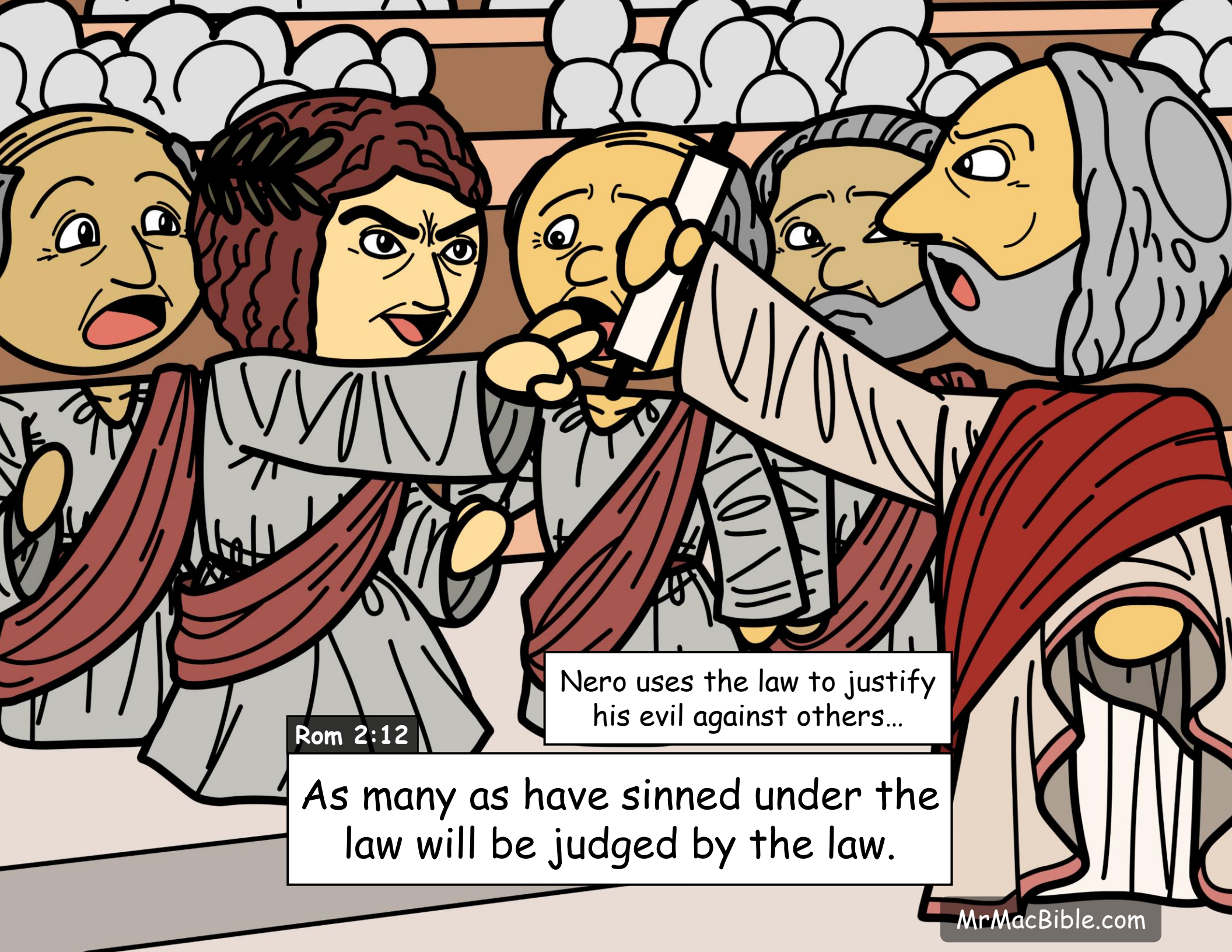
But glory, honour, and peace go to every man who does good, to the Jew first, and also to the Greek.



This family is not afraid to die for their faith in Jesus.

Rom 2:11-12


For there is no partiality with God. For as many as have sinned without the law will also perish without the law.



Nero uses the law to justify his evil against others...

Rom 2:12

As many as have sinned under the law will be judged by the law.



Nero uses his laws to harm the faithful...

Rom 2:13


For it isn't the hearers of the law who are righteous before God, but the doers of the law will be justified...



Nero doesn't care who he hurts!

Rom 2:14

(for when Gentiles who don't have the law do by nature the things of the law, these, not having the law, are a law to themselves...



Others use the law to do good...

Rom 2:15

...in that they show the work of the law written in their hearts, their conscience testifying with them, and their thoughts amongst themselves accusing or else excusing them)



Jesus will judge each of us...

Rom 2:16

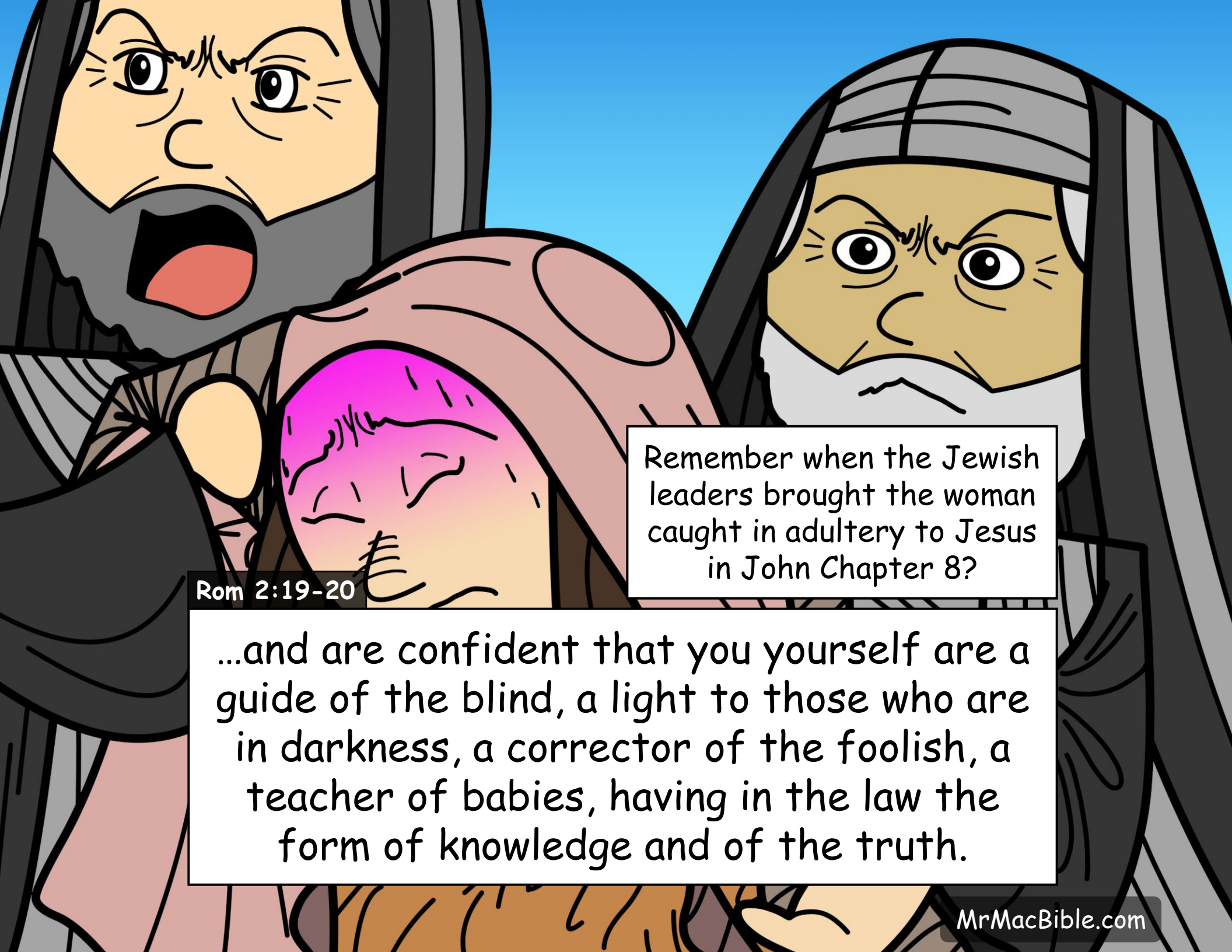
...in the day when God will judge the secrets of men, according to my Good News, by Jesus Christ.



The Gospel came to the Jews first...

Rom 2:17-18

Indeed you bear the name of a Jew, rest on the law, glory in God, know his will, and approve the things that are excellent, being instructed out of the law,



Remember when the Jewish leaders brought the woman caught in adultery to Jesus in John Chapter 8?

Rom 2:19-20


...and are confident that you yourself are a guide of the blind, a light to those who are in darkness, a corrector of the foolish, a teacher of babies, having in the law the form of knowledge and of the truth.



Rom 2:21

How did Jesus respond to the Jewish leaders?

You therefore who teach another, don't you teach yourself?



You who preach that a man
shouldn't steal, do you steal?

Rom 2:21


Are we sometimes a hypocrite?



Do we always practise what we preach?

Rom 2:22


You who say a man shouldn't commit adultery, do you commit adultery?



Remember when Jesus threw out the money changer from the temple?

Rom 2:23


You who abhor idols, do you rob temples?
You who glory in the law, do you dishonour God by disobeying the law?



Do our actions and attitudes sometimes make God "look bad"?

Rom 2:24

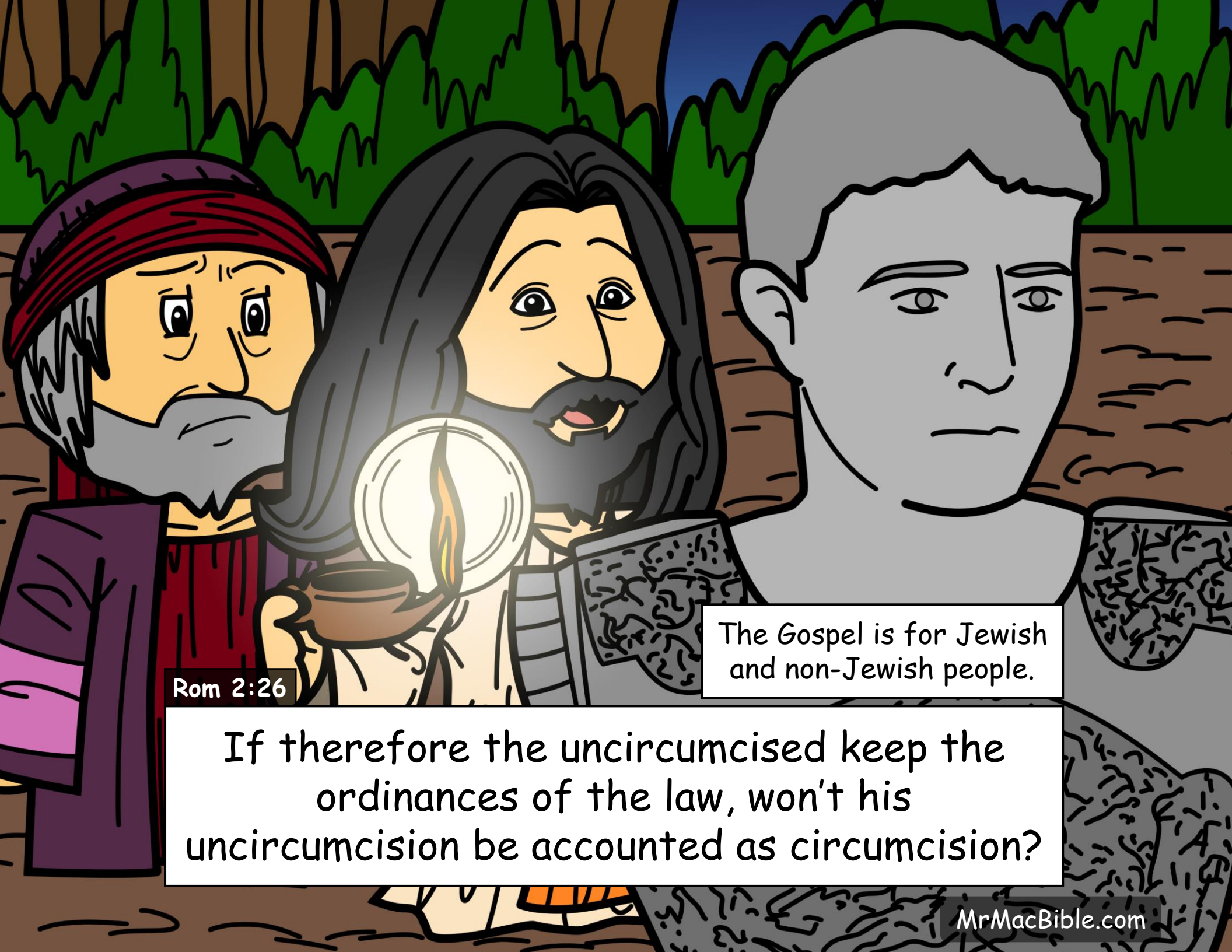
For "the name of God is blasphemed amongst the Gentiles because of you," just as it is written.



God cares about what we do, not just how much we think we know.

Rom 2:25


For circumcision indeed profits, if you are a doer of the law, but if you are a transgressor of the law, your circumcision has become uncircumcision.



Rom 2:26

The Gospel is for Jewish and non-Jewish people.

If therefore the uncircumcised keep the ordinances of the law, won't his uncircumcision be accounted as circumcision?



Judas was an example of someone who "looked like" they were following the law, but he didn't trust in Jesus...

Rom 2:27

Won't those who are physically uncircumcised, but fulfil the law, judge you, who with the letter and circumcision are a transgressor of the law?



Judas

Jesus

Rom 2:28

For he is not a Jew who is one outwardly,
neither is that circumcision which is
outward in the flesh;




Rom 2:29

...but he is a Jew who is one inwardly, and circumcision is that of the heart, in the spirit, not in the letter; whose praise is not from men, but from God.


No One Is Righteous!

Rom 3:1-20

Background:

Abraham (the father of the Jewish story) heard promises directly from God.

Paul will now explain that religious Jewish people have an advantage in life because they were "the first" to be given the Bible. But even if our family has the Bible, we are all born sinners and separated from God...



Abraham learned the rules about
circumcision by God himself.

Rom 3:1


Then what advantage does the Jew have?
Or what is the profit of circumcision?



Moses and the Jews were given the Ten Commandments by God at Mt. Sinai.

Rom 3:2


Much in every way! Because first of all, they were entrusted with the revelations of God.



God's promises are always true... even when we don't believe or obey his word.

Rom 3:3


For what if some were without faith? Will their lack of faith nullify the faithfulness of God? May it never be!



God gave Samson super-strength to do his will even though Samson was not always true to God.

Rom 3:4


Yes, let God be found true, but every man a liar. As it is written, "that you might be justified in your words, and might prevail when you come into judgement."



Samson is about to experience the bad consequences of his sins with Delilah.

Rom 3:5

But if our unrighteousness commends the righteousness of God, what will we say? Is God unrighteous who inflicts wrath? I speak like men do.



Even as a prisoner of the Philistines,
God is not done using Samson!

PAK!

Rom 3:6

May it never be! For then
how will God judge the world?



God gets the glory as Samson completes his mission against God's enemies!

Rom 3:7

For if the truth of God through my lie abounded to his glory, why am I also still judged as a sinner?



Why not (as we are slanderously reported,
and as some affirm that we say),

Paul remembers when he used to
use violence against Christians


Rom 3:8

"Let's do evil, that good may come?"
Those who say so are justly condemned.



Rom 3:9

What then? Are we better than they? No, in no way.



Paul preaches Jesus and repentance
to both Jews and non-Jews...

Rom 3:10

For we previously warned both Jews
and Greeks that they are all under sin.

No one will be saved by their own "goodness".

Rom 3:10

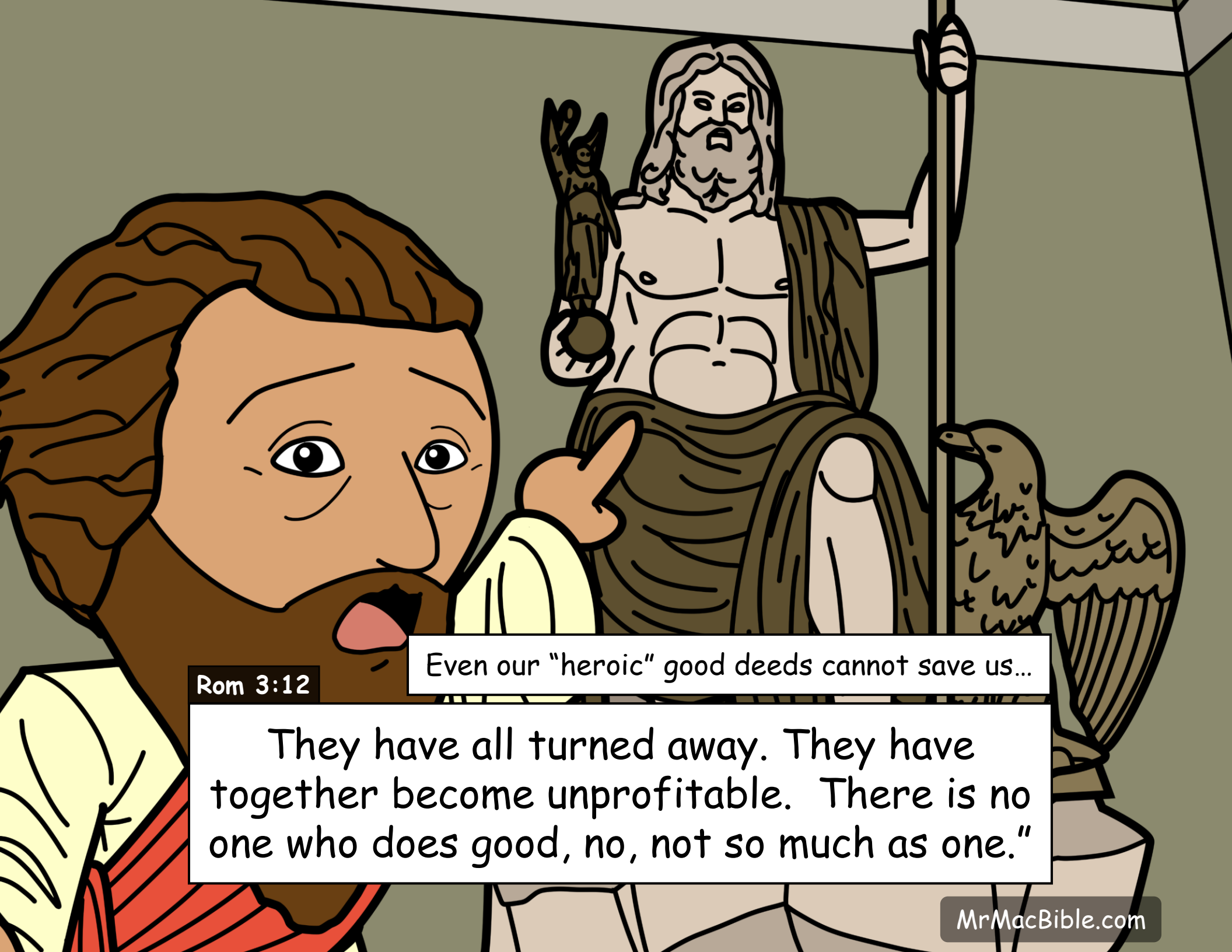
As it is written, "There is no one righteous; no, not one".



Rom 3:11

Some will attack you to ignore your message!


There is no one who understands.
There is no one who seeks after God.



Rom 3:12

Even our "heroic" good deeds cannot save us...


They have all turned away. They have together become unprofitable. There is no one who does good, no, not so much as one."



As sinners, sometimes we use our lies like weapons!

Rom 3:13


"Their throat is an open tomb. With their tongues they have used deceit."



...as sinners we slander and speak evil of each other!

Rom 3:14


"The poison of vipers is under their lips."
"Their mouth is full of cursing and bitterness."



As sinners, many of us have even threatened the messengers of Jesus with hate and violence!

Rom 3:15

"Their feet are swift to shed blood.
Destruction and misery are in their ways."



The way of peace, they haven't known."
"There is no fear of God before their eyes."

Rom 3:17-18

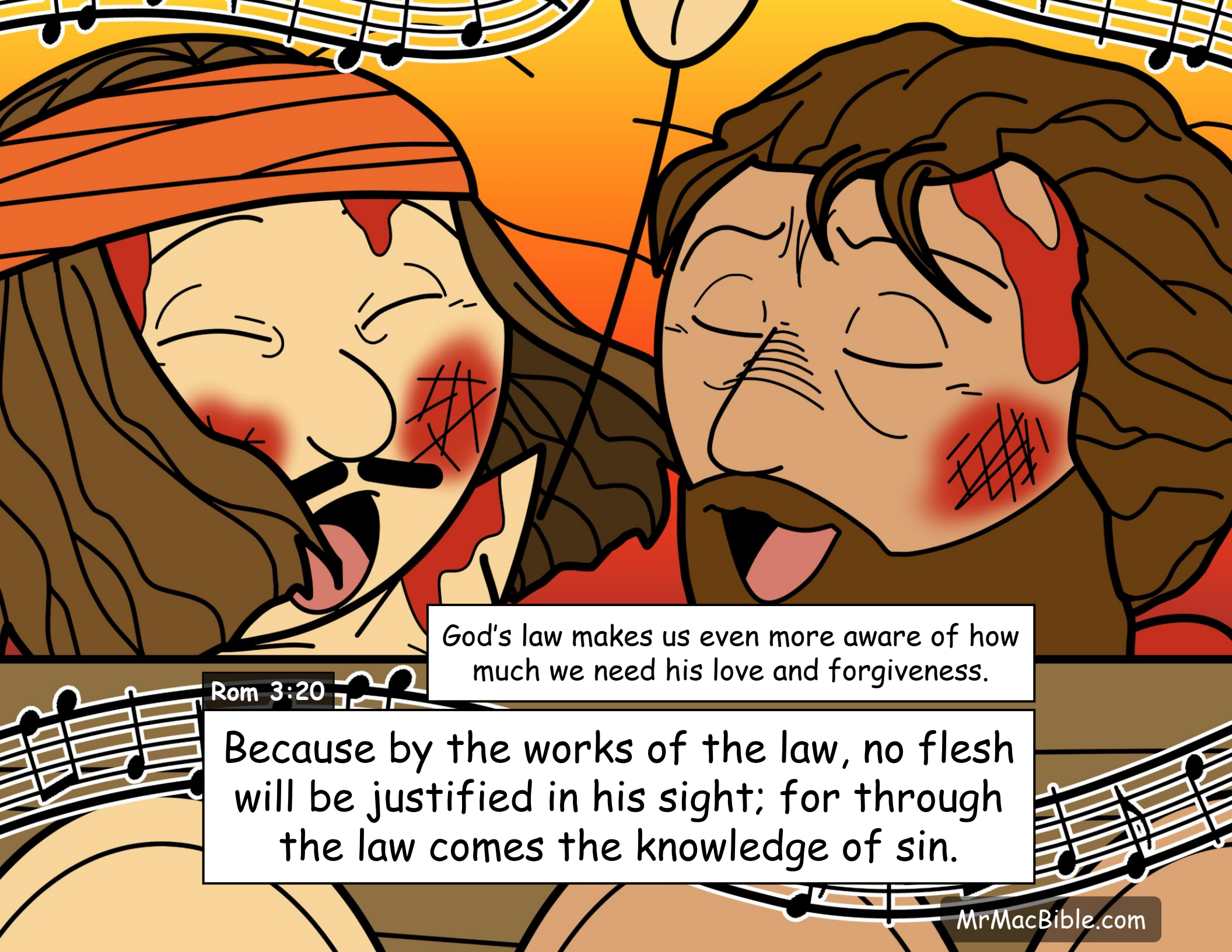
Do we think God will never pay
back sinners for their evil deeds?



But we preach the Gospel to Jews and non-Jews!

Rom 3:19

Now we know that whatever things the law says, it speaks to those who are under the law, that every mouth may be closed, and all the world may be brought under the judgement of God.



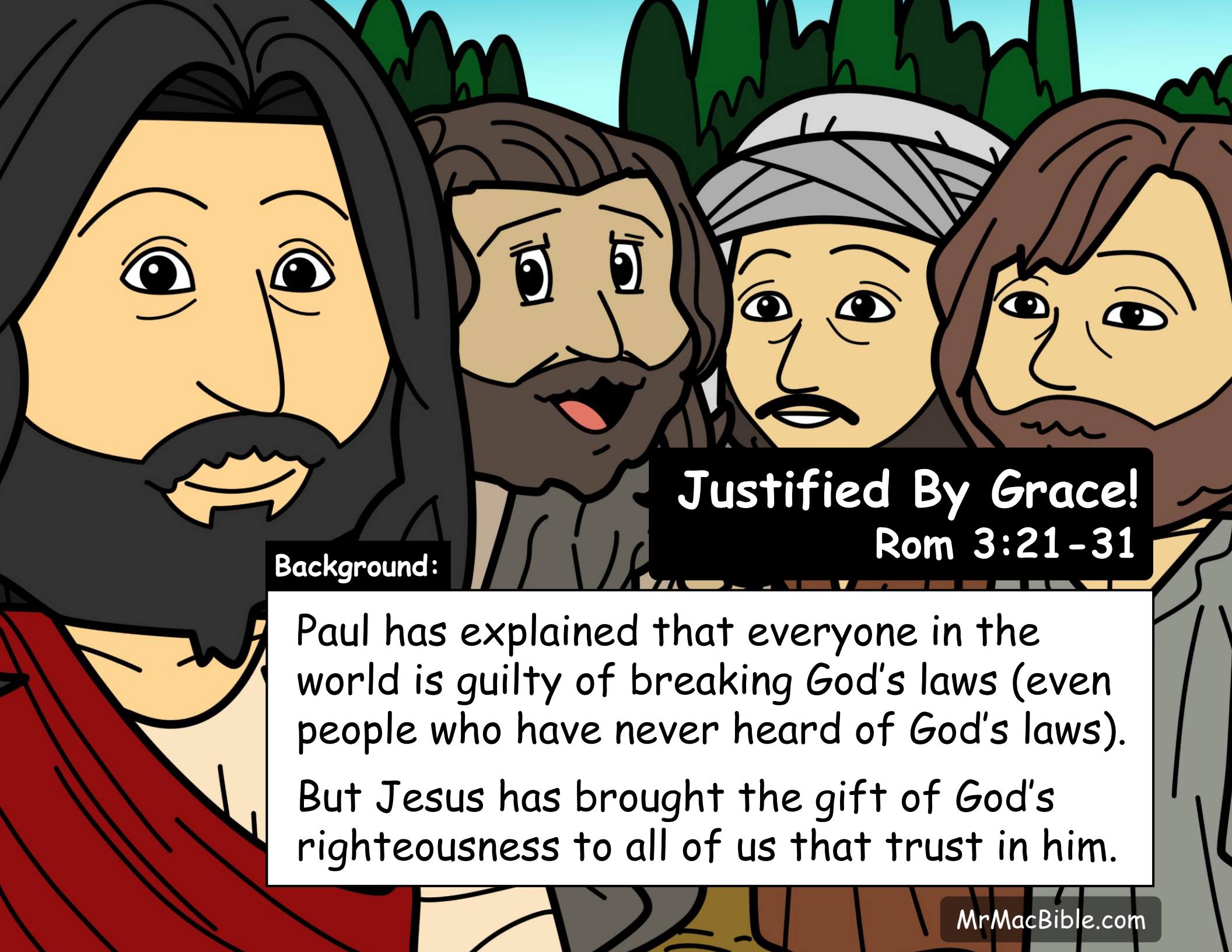
God's law makes us even more aware of how much we need his love and forgiveness.

Rom 3:20

Because by the works of the law, no flesh will be justified in his sight; for through the law comes the knowledge of sin.

Justified By Grace!

Rom 3:21-31

Background:

Paul has explained that everyone in the world is guilty of breaking God's laws (even people who have never heard of God's laws). But Jesus has brought the gift of God's righteousness to all of us that trust in him.



Rom 3:21

God told the prophets in the Old Testament how to become "righteous" by faith...


But now apart from the law, a righteousness of God has been revealed, being testified by the law and the prophets;



God has promised to give us "his righteousness" if we trust in his Son Jesus to wash us clean!

Rom 3:22


...even the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ to all and on all those who believe.



John explains that "no one" is good-enough on their own to bring glory to God...

Rom 3:23


For there is no distinction, for all have sinned, and fall short of the glory of God;



...for we are saved by God's gift of grace because of Jesus.

Rom 3:24


...being justified freely by his grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus,



The death of Jesus on the cross
paid the penalty of all our sins -
past, present and future!

Rom 3:25

...whom God sent to be an atoning sacrifice
through faith in his blood, for a demonstration
of his righteousness through the passing over
of prior sins, in God's forbearance;



Thomas rejoiced that Jesus was risen from the dead!


Rom 3:26

...to demonstrate his righteousness at this present time, that he might himself be just and the justifier of him who has faith in Jesus.



Rom 3:27


Where then is the boasting? It is excluded. By what kind of law? Of works? No, but by a law of faith.



We maintain therefore that a man is justified
by faith apart from the works of the law.

Rom 3:28

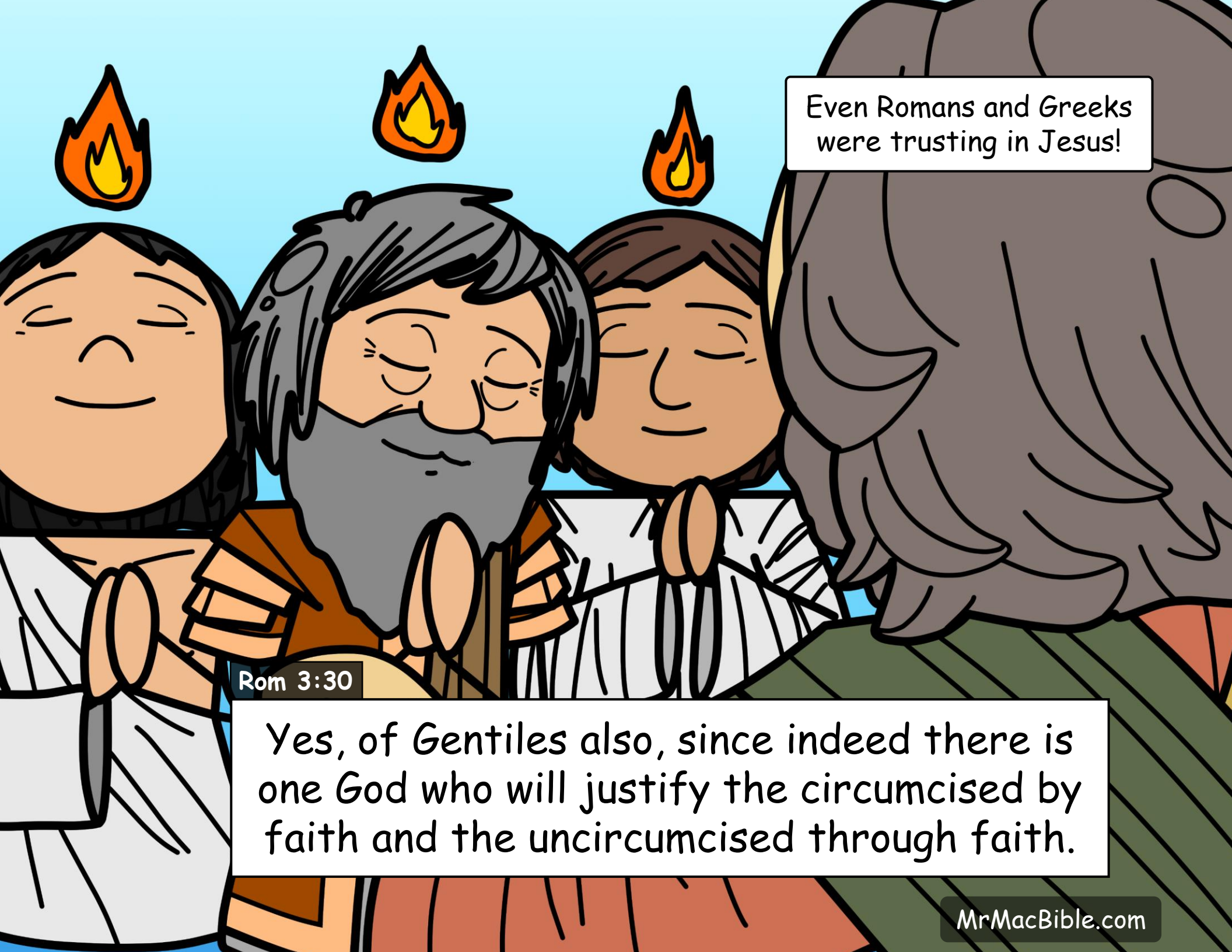
Jesus showed his friends the
marks from his crucifixion.



Remember when Philip baptised
the Ethiopian Leader in ACTS?

Rom 3:29

Or is God the God of Jews only?
Isn't he the God of Gentiles also?



Even Romans and Greeks were trusting in Jesus!

Rom 3:30

Yes, of Gentiles also, since indeed there is one God who will justify the circumcised by faith and the uncircumcised through faith.



Faith in Jesus gives us forgiveness
and the power to do good!

Rom 3:31

Do we then nullify the law through faith?
May it never be! No, we establish the law.

Abraham Believed God!

Rom 4:1-15

Background:

Abraham meets God

Since Paul is writing to Jews in Rome who know the stories of the Old Testament, he will now explain how God's message of faith really began at the beginning of the Bible with the promises given to Abraham.



Rom 4:1

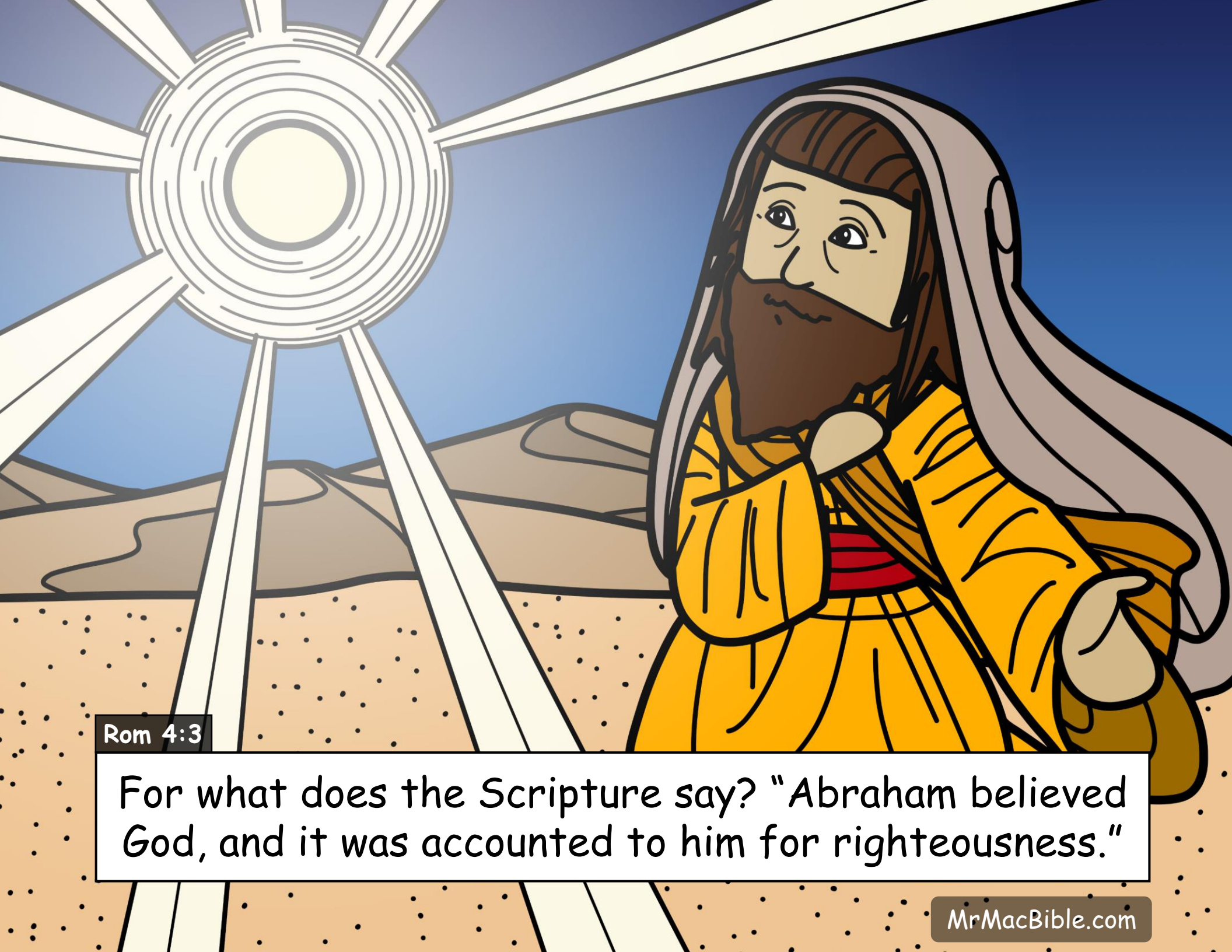
Abraham followed God to the promised land.

What then will we say that Abraham, our forefather, has found according to the flesh?




Rom 4:2

For if Abraham was justified by works, he has something to boast about, but not towards God.



Rom 4:3

For what does the Scripture say? "Abraham believed God, and it was accounted to him for righteousness."



Did Abraham earn his righteousness by being good?... Or by believing God's promise?

Rom 4:4

Now to him who works, the reward is not counted as grace, but as something owed.



Rom 4:5

But to him who doesn't work, but believes in him who justifies the ungodly, his faith is accounted for righteousness.



God's promises were given to King David too!

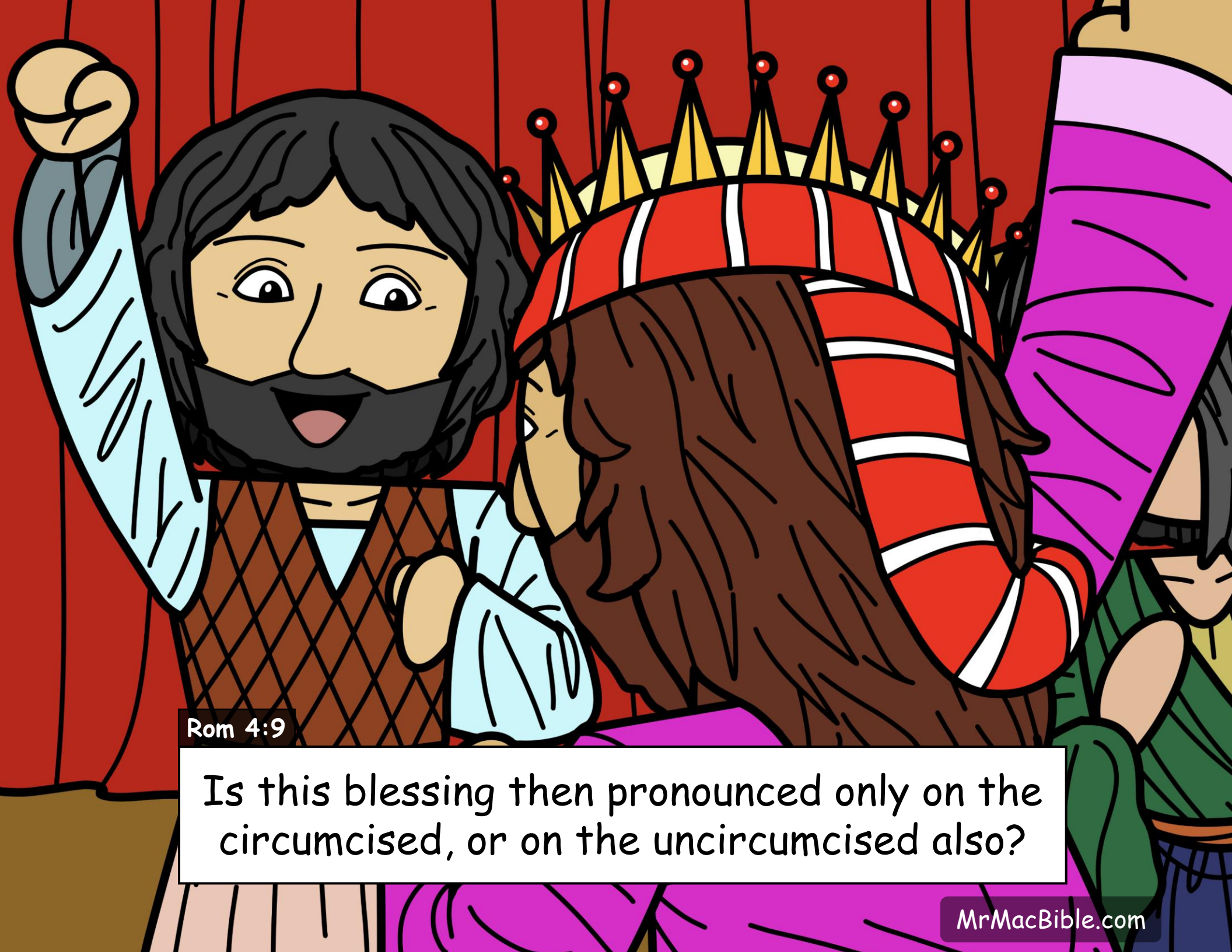
Rom 4:6

Even as David also pronounces blessing on the man to whom God counts righteousness apart from works:



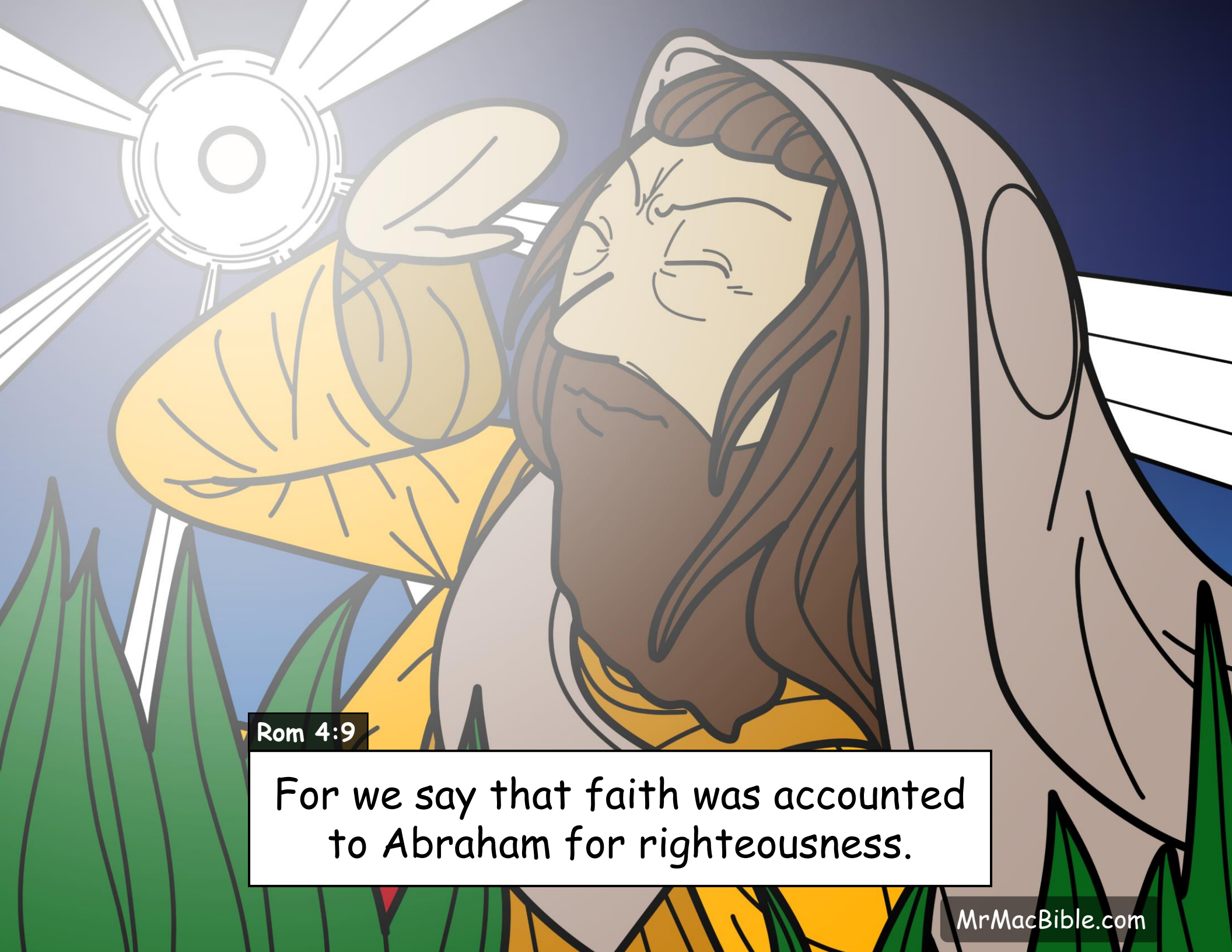
Rom 4:7-8

[From the Psalm of David]: "Blessed are they whose iniquities are forgiven, whose sins are covered. Blessed is the man whom the Lord will by no means charge with sin."




Rom 4:9

Is this blessing then pronounced only on the circumcised, or on the uncircumcised also?



Rom 4:9


For we say that faith was accounted to Abraham for righteousness.



God declared Abraham righteous through his faith [Genesis 15:5] before he obeyed any of God's laws.

Rom 4:10

How then was it counted? When he was in circumcision, or in uncircumcision? Not in circumcision, but in uncircumcision.



He received the sign of circumcision, a seal of the righteousness of the faith which he had while he was in uncircumcision,

Rom 4:11

After Abraham believed the Lord's promises, then he took action to show his faith!



Rom 4:11


...that he might be the father of all those who believe, though they might be in uncircumcision, that righteousness might also be accounted to them.



If we believe God's promises, then Abraham is our father in the faith too!

Rom 4:12


He is the father of circumcision to those who not only are of the circumcision, but who also walk in the steps of that faith of our father Abraham, which he had in uncircumcision.



God promised Abraham that his "seed" would someday bless all the nations [Jesus]...

Rom 4:13

For the promise to Abraham and to his offspring that he would be heir of the world wasn't through the law, but through the righteousness of faith.



Paul often uses the story of Abraham's servant Hagar and her son Ishmael as a metaphor for the kinds of people who try to get righteousness without faith in God's promises.

Rom 4:14

For if those who are of the law are heirs, faith is made void, and the promise is made of no effect.



After the "promised" child Isaac was born, Sarah ordered Hagar and her son Ismael to leave the family!

Rom 4:15

For the law produces wrath; for where there is no law, neither is there disobedience.

Righteousness Credited!

Rom 4:16-25

Background:

Paul continues to explain that God's righteousness comes to us by believing in the promised "seed" [Jesus].

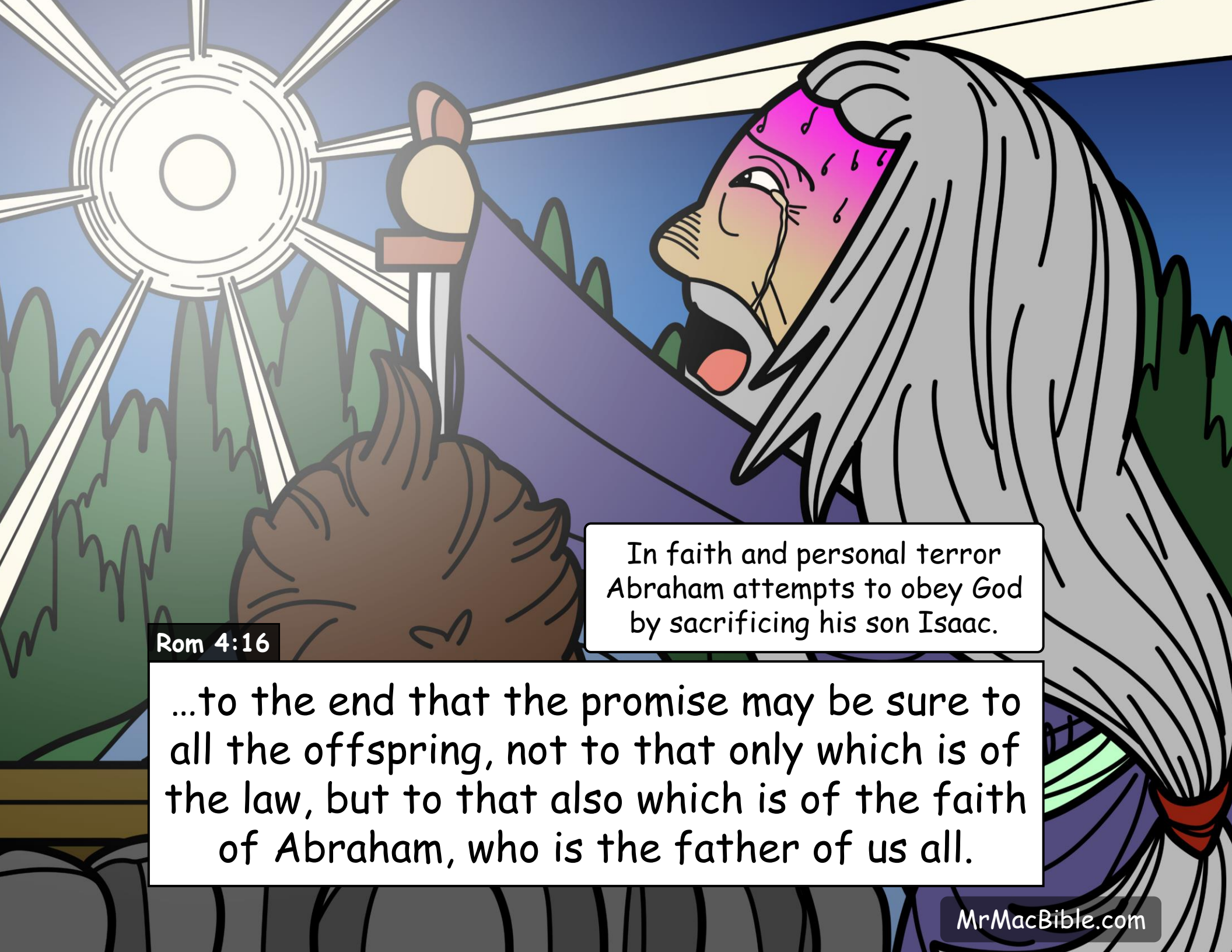
Righteousness does not come by just trying to "be good" on our own.



God asked Abraham to sacrifice his son Isaac [the promised seed] on a special hill. Abraham is preparing for that trip.

Rom 4:16

For this cause it is of faith, that it may be according to grace,



In faith and personal terror Abraham attempts to obey God by sacrificing his son Isaac.

Rom 4:16


...to the end that the promise may be sure to all the offspring, not to that only which is of the law, but to that also which is of the faith of Abraham, who is the father of us all.



God stops Abraham...

Rom 4:17

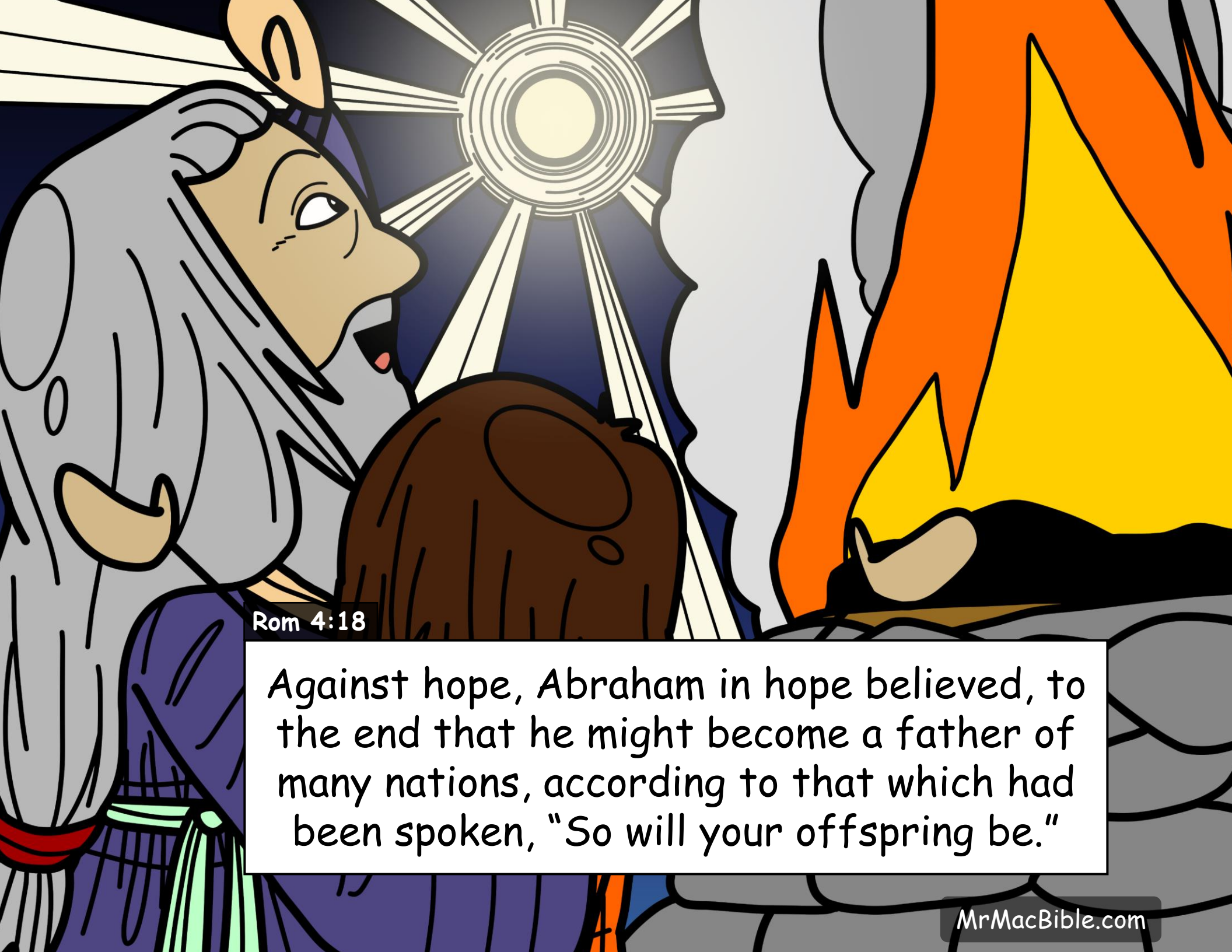
As it is written, "I have made you a father of many nations."



God provided a substitution
for the sacrifice of his son.


Rom 4:17

This is in the presence of him whom he believed:
God, who gives life to the dead, and calls the
things that are not, as though they were.



Rom 4:18

Against hope, Abraham in hope believed, to the end that he might become a father of many nations, according to that which had been spoken, "So will your offspring be."



God miraculously blessed Sarah to conceive the "promised child"

Rom 4:19

Without being weakened in faith, he didn't consider his own body, already having been worn out, (he being about a hundred years old), and the deadness of Sarah's womb.



Isaac is the "promised" child!

Rom 4:20

Yet, looking to the promise of God,
he didn't waver through unbelief,




Rom 4:20

...but [Abraham] grew strong through faith, giving glory to God,



Rom 4:21


...and [Abraham] being fully assured that what he had promised, he was also able to perform.



Abraham believed the promise that someday his "seed" would bless the nations [Jesus]...

Rom 4:22


Therefore it also was "credited to him for righteousness."



Jesus, is the promised "seed" of Abraham to bless the nations... when God would sacrifice his own son to save us!

Rom 4:23

Now it was not written that it was accounted to him for his sake alone, but for our sake also, to whom it will be accounted,



Jesus showed the marks of his crucifixion to his followers after he rose from the dead!

Rom 4:24

[We] ...who believe in him who raised Jesus our Lord from the dead,

Governor Pilate hurt Jesus as he brought him to trial before the Jews...

Rom 4:25

[Jesus] ...who was delivered up for our trespasses,



But death could not hold Jesus!

Rom 4:25

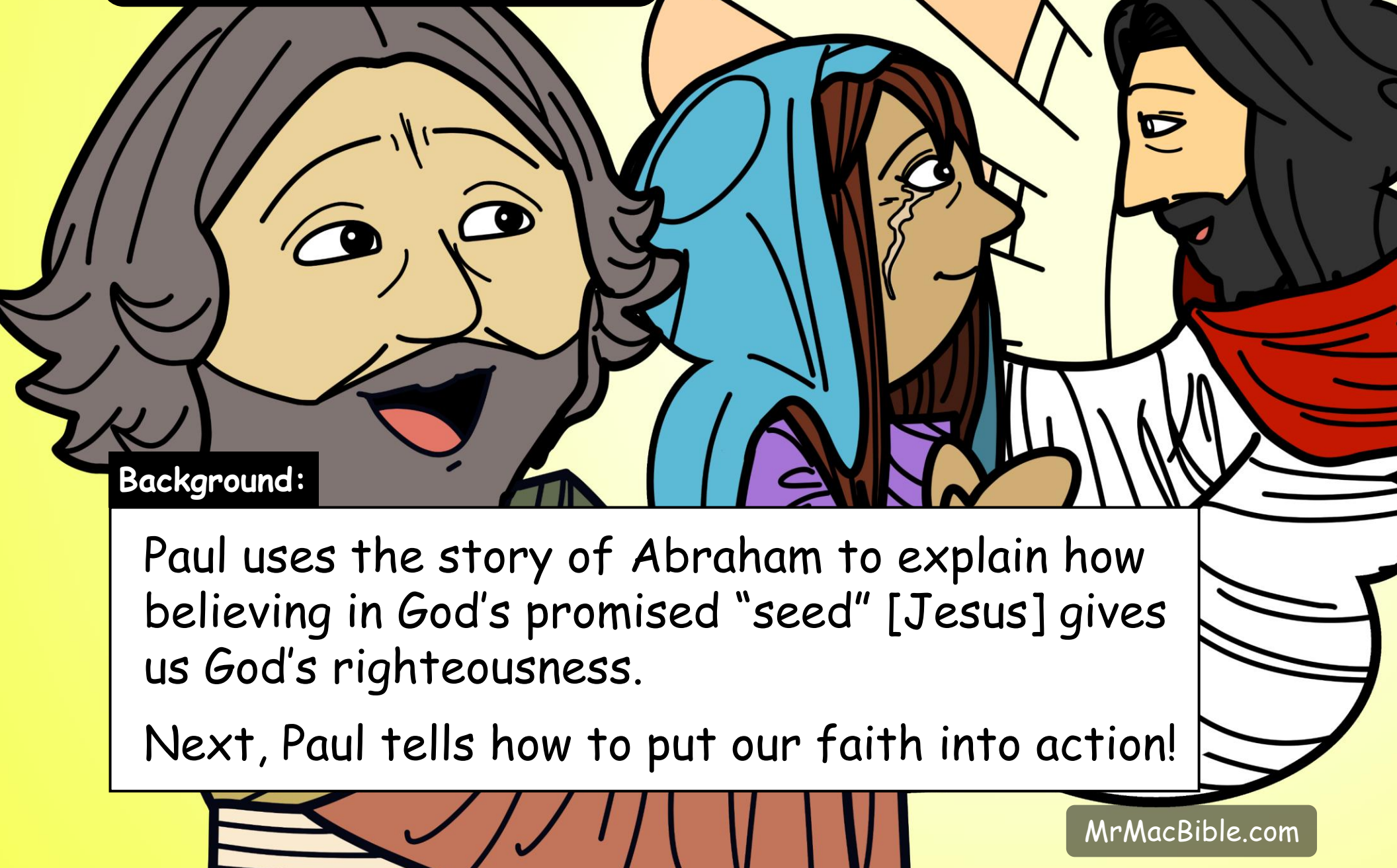
...and [Jesus] was raised for our justification.

Justified By Faith!


Rom 5:1-10



Background:

Paul uses the story of Abraham to explain how believing in God's promised "seed" [Jesus] gives us God's righteousness.

Next, Paul tells how to put our faith into action!



When God's righteousness is given to us through our faith, we are no longer enemies in trouble with God.

Rom 5:1

Being therefore justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ;



...Now we can talk to God with confidence!

Rom 5:2

...through whom [Jesus] we also have our access by faith into this grace in which we stand.



...and God's joy fills us with his strength!

Rom 5:2


We rejoice in hope of the glory of God.



...So that we have confidence even when suffering for Jesus!

Rom 5:3

Not only this, but we also rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces perseverance;



...and we're filled with courage to speak for Jesus and to do good in his name!

Rom 5:4

...and perseverance, [produces] proven character; and proven character, hope;



...and the love of Christ pours into our lives and flows out toward others... even toward our enemies!

Rom 5:5


...and hope doesn't disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who was given to us.

Romans 1:1-16 1 Paul, a servant of Jesus Christ, called to be an apostle, set apart for the Good News of God,

2 which he promised before through his prophets in the holy Scriptures,

3 concerning his Son, who was born of the offspring of David according to the flesh, 4 who was declared to be the Son of God with power according to the Spirit of holiness, by the resurrection from the dead, Jesus Christ our Lord,

5 through whom we received grace and apostleship for obedience of faith amongst all the nations for his name's sake; 6 amongst whom you are also called to belong to Jesus Christ;

7 to all who are in Rome, beloved of God, called to be saints: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

8 First, I thank my God through Jesus Christ for all of you, that your faith is proclaimed throughout the whole world.

9 For God is my witness, whom I serve in my spirit in the Good News of his Son,

how unceasingly I make mention of you always in my prayers,

10 requesting, if by any means now at last I may be prospered by the will of God to come to you.

11 For I long to see you, that I may impart to you some spiritual gift, to the end that you may be established; 12 that is, that I with you may be encouraged in you, each of us by the other's faith, both yours and mine.

13 Now I don't desire to have you unaware, brothers, that I often planned to come to you (and was hindered so far), that I might have some fruit amongst you also, even as amongst the rest of the Gentiles.

14 I am debtor both to Greeks and to foreigners, both to the wise and to the foolish.

15 So as much as is in me, I am eager to preach the Good News to you also who are in Rome.

16 For I am not ashamed of the Good News of Christ, because it is the power of God for salvation for everyone who

Rom 1:16-28 believes, for the Jew first, and also for the Greek.

17 For in it is revealed God's righteousness from faith to faith. As it is written, "But the righteous shall live by faith."

18 For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men who suppress the truth in unrighteousness, 19 because that which is known of God is revealed in them, for God revealed it to them.

20 For the invisible things of him since the creation of the world are clearly seen, being perceived through the things that are made, even his everlasting power and divinity, that they may be without excuse.

21 Because knowing God, they didn't glorify him as God, and didn't give thanks, but became vain in their reasoning, and their senseless heart was darkened.

22 Professing themselves to be wise, they became fools, 23 and traded the glory of the incorruptible God for the likeness of an image of corruptible man,

and of birds, four-footed animals, and creeping things.

24 Therefore God also gave them up in the lusts of their hearts to uncleanness, that their bodies should be dishonoured amongst themselves;

25 who exchanged the truth of God for a lie, and worshipped and served the creature rather than the Creator, who is blessed forever. Amen.

26 For this reason, God gave them up to vile passions. For their women changed the natural function into that which is against nature.

27 Likewise also the men, leaving the natural function of the woman, burnt in their lust towards one another, men doing what is inappropriate with men, and receiving in themselves the due penalty of their error.

28 Even as they refused to have God in their knowledge, God gave them up to a reprobate mind, to do those things which are not fitting;

29 being filled with all unrighteousness, sexual immorality, wickedness,

Rom 1:29-2:12 ... covetousness, malice; full of envy, murder, strife, deceit, evil habits, secret slanderers, 30 backbiters, hateful to God, insolent, arrogant, boastful, inventors of evil things, disobedient to parents,

31 without understanding, covenant breakers, without natural affection, unforgiving, unmerciful;

32 who, knowing the ordinance of God, that those who practise such things are worthy of death, not only do the same, but also approve of those who practise them.

2:1 Therefore you are without excuse, O man, whoever you are who judge. For in that which you judge another, you condemn yourself. For you who judge practise the same things.

2 We know that the judgement of God is according to truth against those who practise such things.

3 Do you think this, O man who judges those who practise such things, and do the same, that you will escape the judgement of God? 4 Or do you despise

the riches of his goodness, forbearance, and patience, not knowing that the goodness of God leads you to repentance?

5 But according to your hardness and unrepentant heart you are treasuring up for yourself wrath in the day of wrath, revelation, and of the righteous judgement of God, 6 who "will pay back to everyone according to their works:"

7 to those who by perseverance in well-doing seek for glory, honour, and incorruptibility, eternal life;

8 but to those who are self-seeking and don't obey the truth, but obey unrighteousness, will be wrath, indignation, 9 oppression, and anguish on every soul of man who does evil, to the Jew first, and also to the Greek.

10 But glory, honour, and peace go to every man who does good, to the Jew first, and also to the Greek.

11 For there is no partiality with God.

12 For as many as have sinned without the law will also perish without the law. As many as have sinned under

Rom 2:12-28 ...the law will be judged by the law.

13 For it isn't the hearers of the law who are righteous before God, but the doers of the law will be justified

14 (for when Gentiles who don't have the law do by nature the things of the law, these, not having the law, are a law to themselves, 15 in that they show the work of the law written in their hearts, their conscience testifying with them, and their thoughts amongst themselves accusing or else excusing them) 16 in the day when God will judge the secrets of men, according to my Good News, by Jesus Christ.

17 Indeed you bear the name of a Jew, rest on the law, glory in God, 18 know his will, and approve the things that are excellent, being instructed out of the law, 19 and are confident that you yourself are a guide of the blind, a light to those who are in darkness, 20 a corrector of the foolish, a teacher of babies, having in the law the form of knowledge and of the truth.

21 You therefore who teach another,

... don't you teach yourself? You who preach that a man shouldn't steal, do you steal?

22 You who say a man shouldn't commit adultery, do you commit adultery? You who abhor idols, do you rob temples?

23 You who glory in the law, do you dishonour God by disobeying the law?

24 For "the name of God is blasphemed amongst the Gentiles because of you," just as it is written.

25 For circumcision indeed profits, if you are a doer of the law, but if you are a transgressor of the law, your circumcision has become uncircumcision.

26 If therefore the uncircumcised keep the ordinances of the law, won't his uncircumcision be accounted as circumcision?

27 Won't those who are physically uncircumcised, but fulfil the law, judge you, who with the letter and circumcision are a transgressor of the law?

28 For he is not a Jew who is one outwardly, neither is that circumcision

Rom 2:28-3:13 ... which is outward in the flesh; 29 but he is a Jew who is one inwardly, and circumcision is that of the heart, in the spirit, not in the letter; whose praise is not from men, but from God.

3:1 Then what advantage does the Jew have? Or what is the profit of circumcision?

2 Much in every way! Because first of all, they were entrusted with the revelations of God.

3 For what if some were without faith? Will their lack of faith nullify the faithfulness of God?

4 May it never be! Yes, let God be found true, but every man a liar. As it is written, "that you might be justified in your words, and might prevail when you come into judgement."

5 But if our unrighteousness commends the righteousness of God, what will we say? Is God unrighteous who inflicts wrath? I speak like men do.

6 May it never be! For then how will

...God judge the world?

7 For if the truth of God through my lie abounded to his glory, why am I also still judged as a sinner?

8 Why not (as we are slanderously reported, and as some affirm that we say), "Let's do evil, that good may come?" Those who say so are justly condemned.

9 What then? Are we better than they? No, in no way. For we previously warned both Jews and Greeks that they are all under sin.

10 As it is written, "There is no one righteous; no, not one.

11 There is no one who understands. There is no one who seeks after God.

12 They have all turned away. They have together become unprofitable. There is no one who does good, no, not so much as one."

13 "Their throat is an open tomb. With their tongues they have used deceit."

Rom 3:13-31 "The poison of vipers is under their lips."

14 "Their mouth is full of cursing and bitterness." 15 "Their feet are swift to shed blood.

16 Destruction and misery are in their ways. 17 The way of peace, they haven't known." 18 "There is no fear of God before their eyes."

19 Now we know that whatever things the law says, it speaks to those who are under the law, that every mouth may be closed, and all the world may be brought under the judgement of God.

20 Because by the works of the law, no flesh will be justified in his sight; for through the law comes the knowledge of sin.

21 But now apart from the law, a righteousness of God has been revealed, being testified by the law and the prophets; 22 even the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ to all and on all those who believe.

For there is no distinction, 23 for all ...have sinned, and fall short of the glory

of God;

24 being justified freely by his grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, 25 whom God sent to be an atoning sacrifice through faith in his blood, for a demonstration of his righteousness through the passing over of prior sins, in God's forbearance;

26 to demonstrate his righteousness at this present time, that he might himself be just and the justifier of him who has faith in Jesus.

27 Where then is the boasting? It is excluded. By what kind of law? Of works? No, but by a law of faith.

28 We maintain therefore that a man is justified by faith apart from the works of the law.

29 Or is God the God of Jews only? Isn't he the God of Gentiles also? Yes, of Gentiles also, 30 since indeed there is one God who will justify the circumcised by faith and the uncircumcised through faith.

31 Do we then nullify the law through faith? May it never be! No, we establish the law.

Rom 4:1-14 What then will we say that Abraham, our forefather, has found according to the flesh?

2 For if Abraham was justified by works, he has something to boast about, but not towards God.

3 For what does the Scripture say? "Abraham believed God, and it was accounted to him for righteousness."

4 Now to him who works, the reward is not counted as grace, but as something owed.

5 But to him who doesn't work, but believes in him who justifies the ungodly, his faith is accounted for righteousness.

6 Even as David also pronounces blessing on the man to whom God counts righteousness apart from works:

7 "Blessed are they whose iniquities are forgiven, whose sins are covered.

8 Blessed is the man whom the Lord will by no means charge with sin."

9 Is this blessing then pronounced only on the circumcised, or on the

...uncircumcised also? For we say that faith was accounted to Abraham for righteousness.

10 How then was it counted? When he was in circumcision, or in uncircumcision? Not in circumcision, but in uncircumcision.

11 He received the sign of circumcision, a seal of the righteousness of the faith which he had while he was in uncircumcision, that he might be the father of all those who believe, though they might be in uncircumcision, that righteousness might also be accounted to them.

12 He is the father of circumcision to those who not only are of the circumcision, but who also walk in the steps of that faith of our father Abraham, which he had in uncircumcision.

13 For the promise to Abraham and to his offspring that he would be heir of the world wasn't through the law, but through the righteousness of faith.

14 For if those who are of the law are heirs, faith is made void, and the

Rom 4:14-5:4 ...promise is made of no effect.

15 For the law produces wrath; for where there is no law, neither is there disobedience.

16 For this cause it is of faith, that it may be according to grace, to the end that the promise may be sure to all the offspring, not to that only which is of the law, but to that also which is of the faith of Abraham, who is the father of us all.

17 As it is written, "I have made you a father of many nations." This is in the presence of him whom he believed: God, who gives life to the dead, and calls the things that are not, as though they were.

18 Against hope, Abraham in hope believed, to the end that he might become a father of many nations, according to that which had been spoken, "So will your offspring be."

19 Without being weakened in faith, he didn't consider his own body, already having been worn out, (he being about a hundred years old), and the deadness of Sarah's womb.

20 Yet, looking to the promise of God, he didn't waver through unbelief, but grew strong through faith, giving glory to God, 21 and being fully assured that what he had promised, he was also able to perform.

22 Therefore it also was "credited to him for righteousness."

23 Now it was not written that it was accounted to him for his sake alone, 24 but for our sake also, to whom it will be accounted, who believe in him who raised Jesus our Lord from the dead, 25 who was delivered up for our trespasses, and was raised for our justification.

5:1 Being therefore justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ; 2 through whom we also have our access by faith into this grace in which we stand. We rejoice in hope of the glory of God.

3 Not only this, but we also rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces perseverance; 4 and perseverance, proven character; and proven character, hope;

Rom 5:5-17 ...and hope doesn't disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who was given to us.

6 For while we were yet weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly.

7 For one will hardly die for a righteous man. Yet perhaps for a good person someone would even dare to die.
