When the Philistine arose, and walked and came near to meet David, David hurried and ran towards the army to meet the Philistine.

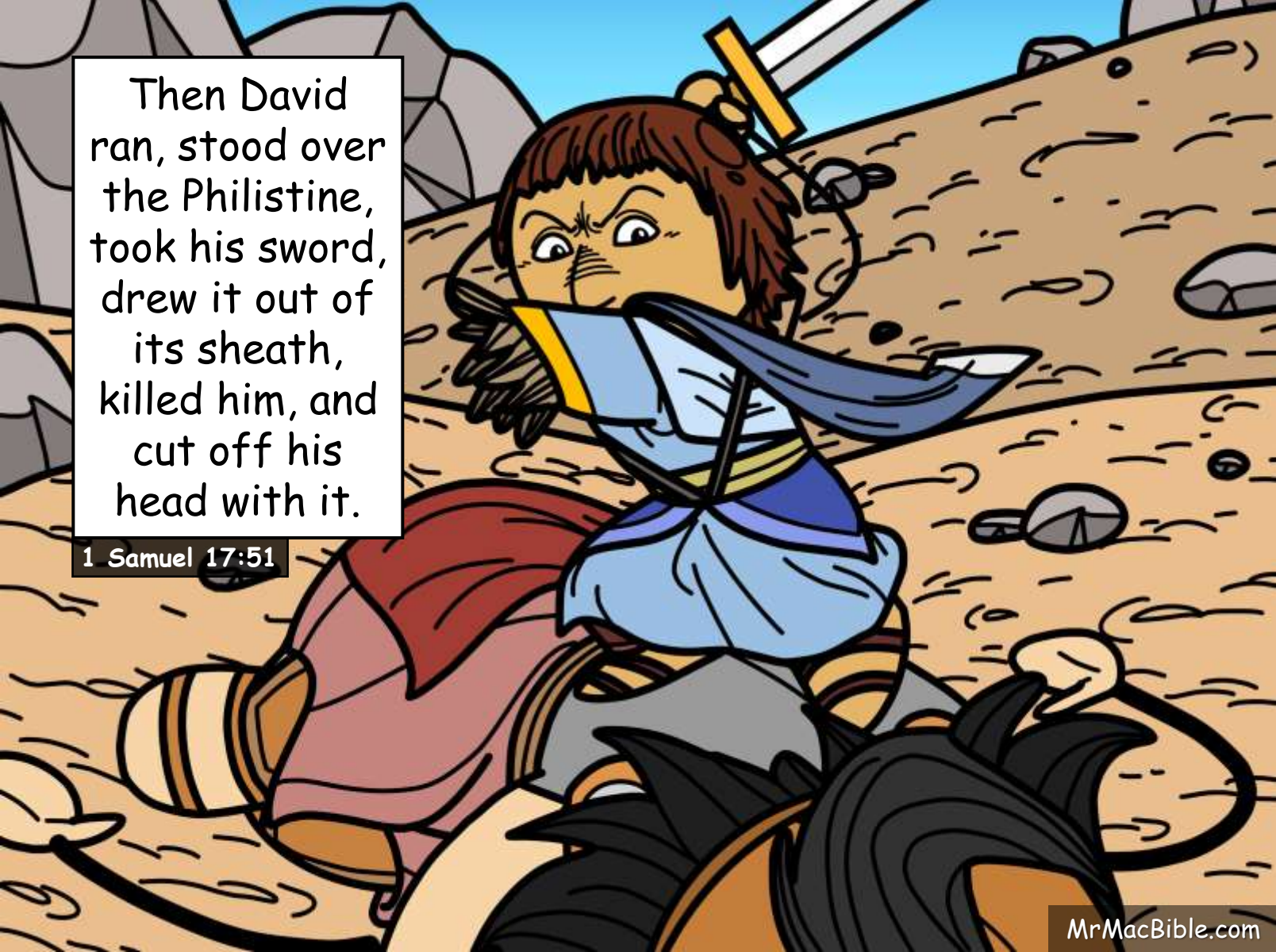

When the mourning was past, David sent and took her home to his house, and she became his wife and bore him a son.

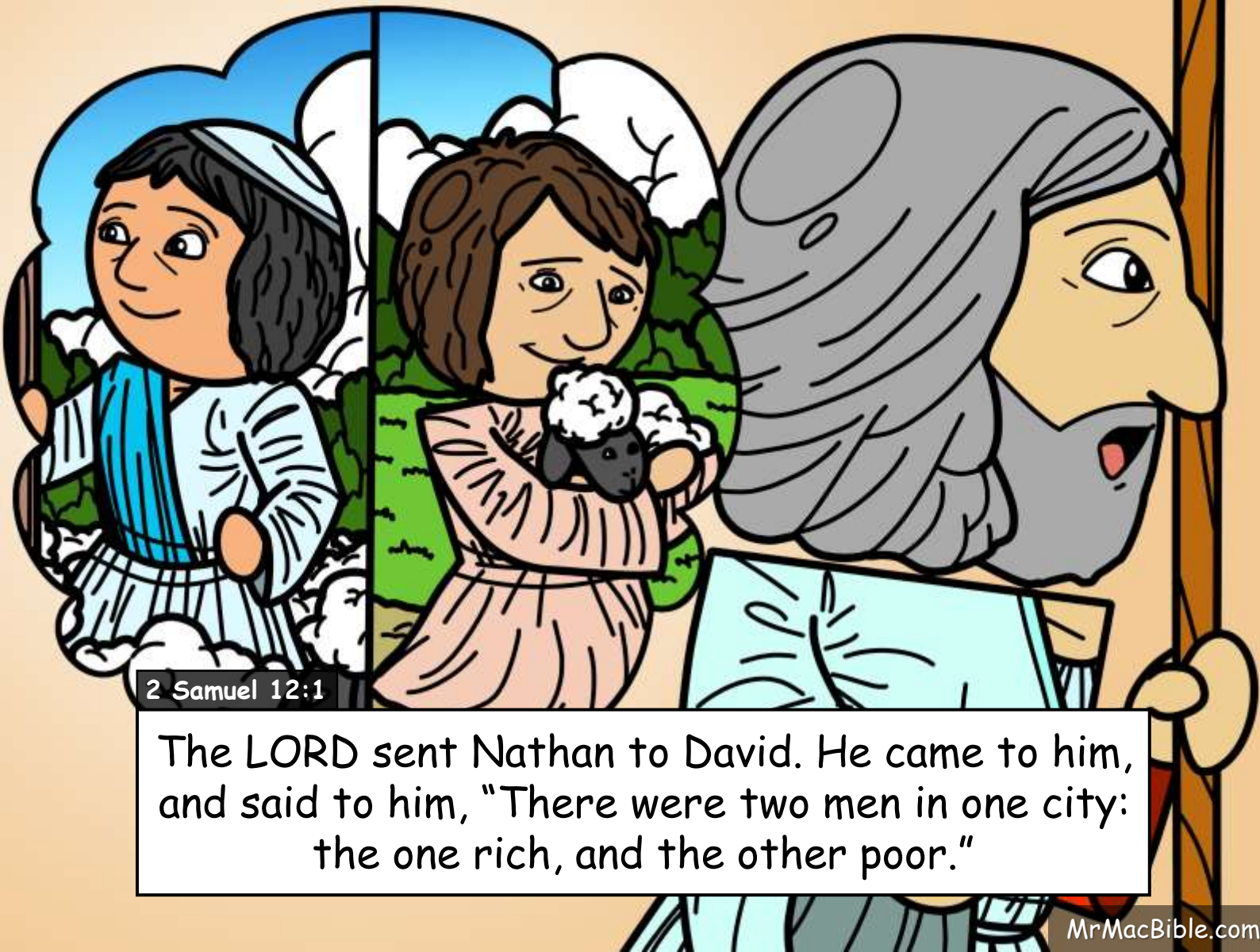

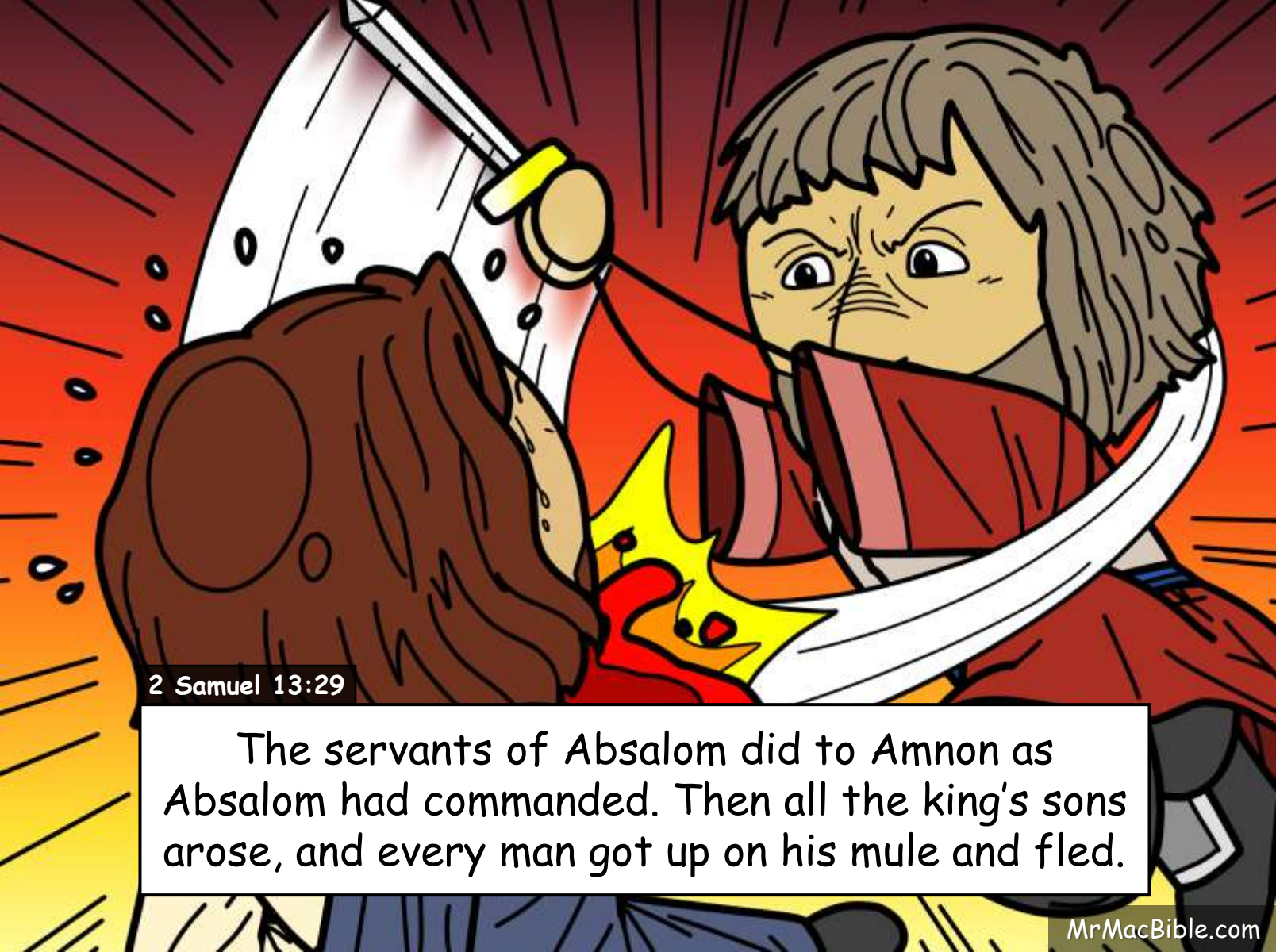
After two full years, Absalom had sheep shearers in Baal Hazor, which is beside Ephraim; and Absalom invited all the king's sons.

After this, Absalom prepared a chariot and horses for himself, and fifty men to run before him.



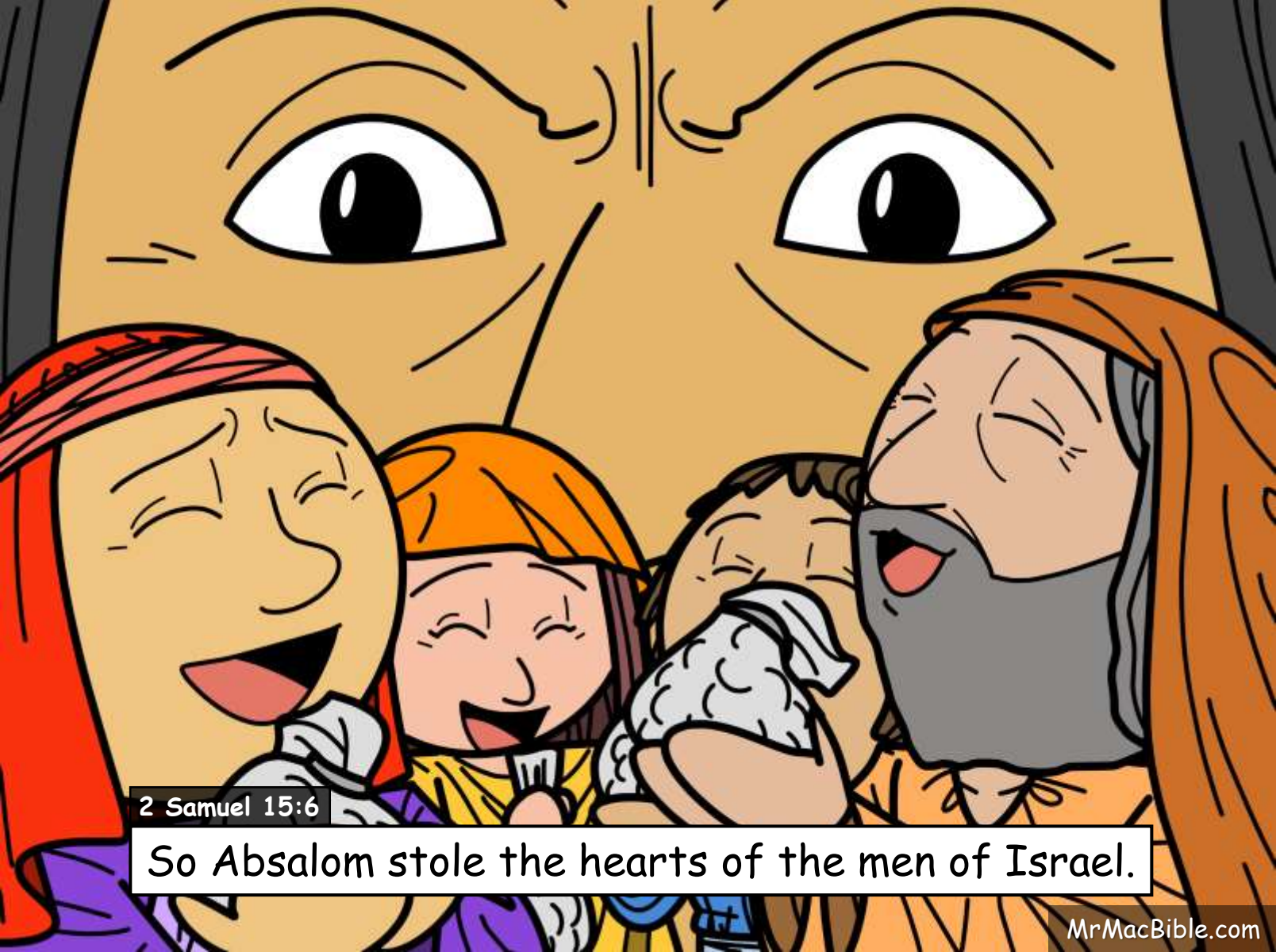
